WELCOME TO THE SIXTEENTH SEASON!



A producer born and reared in Sullivan, Illinois, Guy S. Little, Jr. has become a pivotal influence in the world of professional stock theatre and in the lives of hundreds of young theatre-minded aspirants during his sixteen years of operation at The Little Theatre-On The Square. He has realized a dream from childhood days by owning and operating his own "live" theatre successfully and from his first opening night in 1957 with the first production of a "Summer of Musicals", the curtain has risen for over one hundred and sixty-seven major opening nights. And from the 1957 season of eight weeks and a total attendance of 8,000, he has cycled his theatre art presentations to nearly 100,000 in last season's thirty weeks.

Education is an important factor in pursuing a career in theatre, according to Guy Little, Jr., whether it is to

finalize in being a producer, actor or technical artist and he has dedicated his life to the continuous study of all phases of the theatre. After graduation from the University of Miami where he met his wife, Jerili, and three seasons of doing the "dirty work" of being an apprentice in Eastern stock theatres, he returned to the mid-west to scout for a location to open a musical theatre. Buffeted by skeptics in larger area cities, he finally settled for leasing the old Grand Movie house in Sullivan for his first attempt at bringing professional stock theatre to central Illinois. Who's Who in the Cast . . .

FRANK SUTTON (Moonface) became famous from Coast to Coast for his five year stint as Sergeant Carter, the funniest Sergeant in the Marine Corps on *Gomer Pyle - U.S.M.C.* After his more than honorable discharge from that television series, he spent the next two years as a singer-dancer-laugh-provoking star on CBS' *Jim Nabors' Hour* where he did everything from situation comedy to stand-up monologues.

Bitten by the acting bug early in life, Mr. Sutton starred in his first Community Theatre production of *Twelfth Night* in Nashville, Tennessee, his home town. After graduating from high school, he took a job as announcer and disc jockey in Arkansas, but the war intervened and he spent three years on duty in the South Pacific—yes, as a Sergeant! Upon his discharge, he enrolled in Columbia University, majoring in Drama, and graduated Cum Laude. While still studying at Columbia, he made two debuts, first as a bridegroom to his wife, Toby, and his professional debut with a Pennsylvania stock theatre company. Shortly after he and Toby were married, he left the company to join the National Company of *The Barretts Of Wimpole Street* and when the tour returned to New York, he learned that he was in considerable demand in the new and growing TV industry. The Sutton technique and talent insured a steady parade of roles and in 1954, he was cast in the Academy Award winning film, *Marty*, which was the beginning of the big time for him, leading to a variety of roles in TV and films. Some of his feature films were *Four Boys And A Gun*, *Town Without Pity* and *The Satan Bug* and his television credits include *Love American Style*, *Route 66*, *Naked City*, *The Defenders*, *Studio One*, *Gunsmoke*, *The Fugitive* and *The Untouchables*.

The Suttons have two children, Amanda, 8 and Joey, 18, and live in a beautiful Spanish style home in Beverly Hills.

JAMIE DONNELLY (Reno) created the role of Ethel Levey in the original Broadway cast of *George M!* which starred Joel Grey. Other Broadway and off-Broadway credits include *Flora*, *The Red Menace*, *You're A Good Man, Charlie Brown* and *Babes In Arms*. She was CBS TV's Dusty McGuire on *The Guiding Light* and played the lead role of Prunella in the film, *All The Other Outs In Free*.

Mr. King has toured in the national companies of *Half A Sixpence* and *Walking Happy*, and is a familiar figure in off-Broadway productions, major TV shows and stock theatres. Since leaving Sullivan last year, he has appeared in *Norman, Is That You?* in Louisville, *Tom Jones* in Cincinnati and has made numerous TV commercials.

Miss Best was featured in the national touring company of *Jane Eyre* with Sylvia Sidney, with Luther Adler in *Angel Street* and with Helmut Dantine in *Miami Beach*. She is a popular actress in the Chicago area and has appeared with such stars as Joan Caulfield, Louis Nye, Mamie Van Doren, Walter Pidgeon, Jeanne Crain, Joan Fontaine and Tom Poston. This season she has appeared in Rodgers and Hammerstein's musical, *Cinderella*, *A Christmas Carol* and Goodman Theatre's *The Royal Family* with Cathleen Nesbitt.

ROBERT MORGAN (Whitney) began his theatre career at the famed Pasadena Playhouse along with Dana Andrews, Don De Fore and Robert Preston.
