#### GREETINGS FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



Dear Patrons:

Last year The Little Theatre On The Square received a \$200,000 grant from Senator Duane Noland and a \$100,000 grant from Representative Julie Curry. We are indeed grateful for their faith in us. Some of the money was used to purchase the building across the square that we use as a dance studio/rehearsal hall. We are remodeling apartments on the 2nd and 3rd floor of the building to use as housing for our company members.

We also purchased the former Shasteen Ford dealership building behind the theatre and we are turning it into our technical production facility. It will house sets and props construction and storage, scenic painting and costume construction and storage.

At the end of last summer we were informed that the building next to the theatre that has the ticket office and public restrooms had serious structural problems. We moved out of it last fall, performed a "temporary fix" and moved back in April. We have plans to tear this building down and replace it with a new building that will have access to the theatre auditorium and balcony, a concession area, public restrooms, administrative offices and new dressing rooms for the performance company. We hope to unveil the plans to you before the summer season ends. See an architects concept of the new building on page 48.

Leonard has been treasurer of the Sullivan Area Chamber of Commerce, vice-president of the Central Illinois Tourism Council and treasurer of the statewide Illinois Regional Tourism Council.

#### Comments From the Artistic Director

For the past three years, Little Theatre has been a member of the prestigious National Alliance for Musical Theatre, a consortium of 110 theatres in the United States and Europe dedicated to the development and presentation of new musical theatre works. Each fall, we attend a festival of new works in New York City, looking for new musicals to challenge and delight our audiences.

In September of 1999, Lenny and I first saw **HONK!** and knew immediately that it would be a perfect show for The Little Theatre

audiences. Two months later, **HONK!** made its London premiere at Britain's National Theatre, beating out **LION KING** for an Olivier Award (the British equivalent of the Tony's) as the Best Musical of the Year.

This fall, I was asked to join NAMT's Festival Committee, a group of 11 Artistic Directors from around the country, charged with the awesome task of evaluating over 100 new musicals. From them, we will select the eight that will be presented this fall in New York, Hopefully, among them will be another exciting new musical for you to experience next season.

The 2001 Little Theatre Company hopes you enjoy our Midwestern premiere of **HONK!** We are all very excited about this charming new play and hope you will embrace its message of family love and acceptance. As are all members of the National Alliance for Musical Theatre, we at Little Theatre are strongly committed to the development and presentation of new musical pieces for the theatre.

#### M. Seth Reines - Artistic Director

M. Seth Reines is delighted to return for his 14th season as The Little Theatre's Artistic Director, having just directed the West Coast premiere of *Victor/Victoria* with Broadway stars Jennifer Allen, Lee Roy Reams and Thom Sesma. Winner of San Francisco's Drama Logue Award and Cleveland Drama Critics' Award, Seth has directed over 350 productions for regional theatres and PBS with such stars such as Chita Rivera, Angela Lansbury, Tom Wopat, Peter Allen, Leslie Uggams and Jerry Herman. Seth was recently asked to join the Festival Committee of the National Alliance for Musical Theatre, making him one of 11 Artistic Directors in the country to serve on the committee. Dedicated to the development of new musical works, Seth is co-creator of *Monky Business*, which now boasts over 200 international productions since debuting at the Galveston Grand Opera House in 1995. This fall, Seth moves to the Phoenix area to become Artistic Producer of Broadway Palm West.
