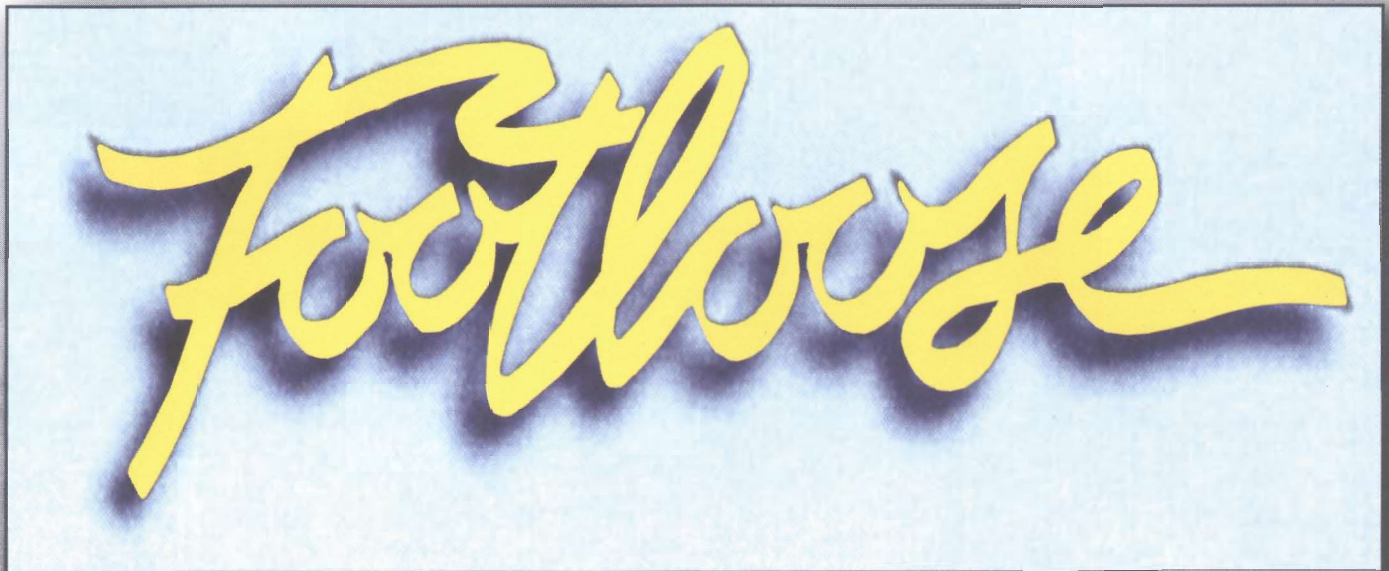

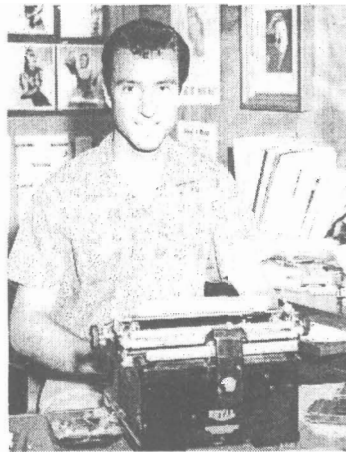

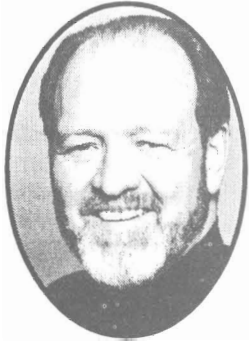

Dear Patrons:

2002 marks the 45th summer season of professional, live theatre at The Little Theatre On The Square in Sullivan, Illinois and the 15th season that I have served as Executive Director and Seth Reines has served as Artistic Director.

Seth and I have been honored to carry forward the legacy started by Guy S. Little, Jr. in 1957 when he came home from college and started his own theatre in his home town. That legacy was picked up by a group of local citizens in 1981 when they formed the not-for-profit corporation that has governed the theatre for the past 22 years. It is a legacy of exploring the human condition and spirit

through the presentation of quality dramatic plays, comedies and musical theatre.

The Board of Trustees of The Little Theatre On The Square, Inc. is currently conducting a feasibility study to determine the goals for a major capital fund-raising campaign scheduled to commence this fall. Our hopes are that we will be able to correct some major deficiencies in our physical plant, enhance the education outreach program started in 1997 and plant the seeds for an endowment fund that will secure the financial future of the institution.

With the continued support from you our loyal patrons, we promise to keep the legacy alive for many years to come.

Leonard became Executive Director of The Little Theatre On The Square on January 1, 1988 after having served as Managing Director of The Black Hills Playhouse in Custer State Park, South Dakota from January 1976 through May of 1987. Prior to that, he was the Business Manager of Theatre Tulsa in Tulsa, Oklahoma. Leonard earned his Bachelor of Fine Arts and Master of Arts degrees in theatre from the University of South Dakota and a Master of Fine Arts degree in Arts Administration from Southern Methodist University in Dallas, Texas. He is originally from St. Joseph, MO and served as a combat infantry platoon leader in Viet-Nam in 1967. Leonard has been treasurer of the Sullivan Area Chamber of Commerce, vice-president of the Central Illinois Tourism Council and treasurer of the statewide Illinois Regional Tourism Council.

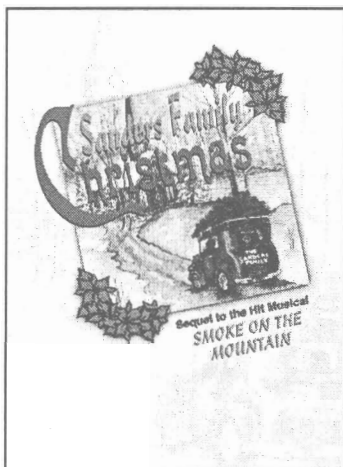
This frenetic entertainment is long on shtick and historical hilarity. It is staged as a backers' audition for an 83.5-million-dollar twelve-hour stage history of the world from creation to the present. Eighteen side-splitting numbers, performed by two actors, portraying Adam and Eve, Attila the Hun, the building of the pyramids, Julius Caesar and Columbus, among others, give potential investors a taste of the impending extravaganza. In the process, the opulent Park Avenue apartment "borrowed" for the occasion is trashed as the two snatch its furnishings to create makeshift costumes while singing and clowning their way through inventive recreations of the past, stopping occasionally for a little supplicating show biz patter.

In this sequel to the ever-popular **Smoke on the Mountain**, the Sanders family returns to Mount Pleasant, North Carolina, on the Christmas Eve of 1941. More than two dozen Christmas carols, many of them vintage hymns, and hilarious yuletide stories from the more or less devout Sanders family keep the audience laughing, clapping and singing along with bluegrass Christmas favorites. Richly entertaining, this wildly infectious musical brings cheer to audiences eager to see how their friends from **Smoke on the Mountain** have been getting along.

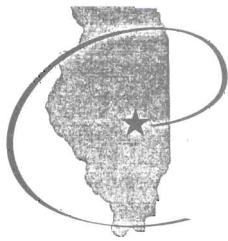

Leave A Legacy

Planned Giving Information Consortium *of East Central Illinois*

Philanthropy is based on voluntary action for the common good. It is a tradition of giving and sharing that is primary to the quality of life.

The people of East Central Illinois are known for their generosity. But not many area people leave gifts to charity in their wills or estates. With that in mind, area managers of wealth and non-profit organizations established the Planned Giving Information Consortium (PGIC) of East Central Illinois devoted to educating the general public about philanthropy in general and about planned giving in specific. The Little Theatre On The Square is a member of and supports the efforts of this consortium.

Leave A Legacy - PGIC has embarked on an initiative that will help further its mission to educate the public and promote the cause of charitable giving through bequests, lifetime giving with retention of income, and estate plans. *Leave A Legacy's* goal is to remind people that they can make a difference in the lives that follow theirs.

Frequently asked questions:

- How do I leave a gift for my favorite nonprofit organization?

It's easy. You can arrange for a gift several ways. The most common is through a charitable gift in a will or living trust. Many people set aside a certain dollar amount. Others leave a percentage of their estate or any assets left over after their family has been provided for. Some people donate something they own, like a car or their home. Others leave a paid life insurance policy, retirement account or other financial investment.

- Do I tell the organization that I have left a gift?

That is up to you. Nonprofit organizations like to know in advance so they can recognize your generosity. They can also tell you about specific opportunities for giving.

- Must I have a sizable estate in order to leave a gift?

Everyone can leave a gift. "Estate" is simply a word used to describe any amount of money, property or personal belongings that you may have at the time of your death. Most people leave an estate when they die, even though they may not have a great deal of wealth. Many gifts are less than \$1,000.

- How do I leave a gift to a specific organization?

A charitable bequest will not take effect unless you state your intention in your will or living trust. Without a will you may lose control over your belongings after death. Then, your property and finances are settled according to state laws, whether or not they coincide with your wishes.

- Who can help me arrange for a gift?

If you have a professional that you are working with like a financial planner, lawyer, accountant or insurance agent, please talk with them about leaving a gift. A professional can tell you about the tax benefits of planned gifts. You can also call a nonprofit organization directly for assistance.

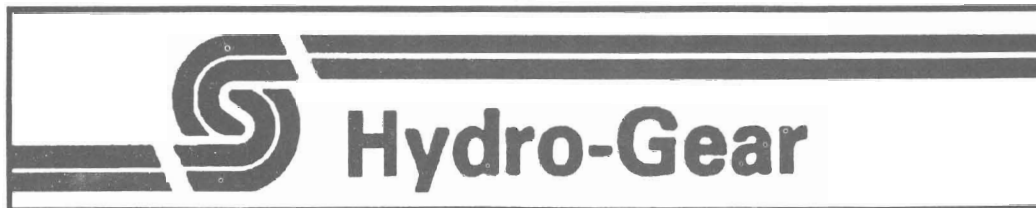
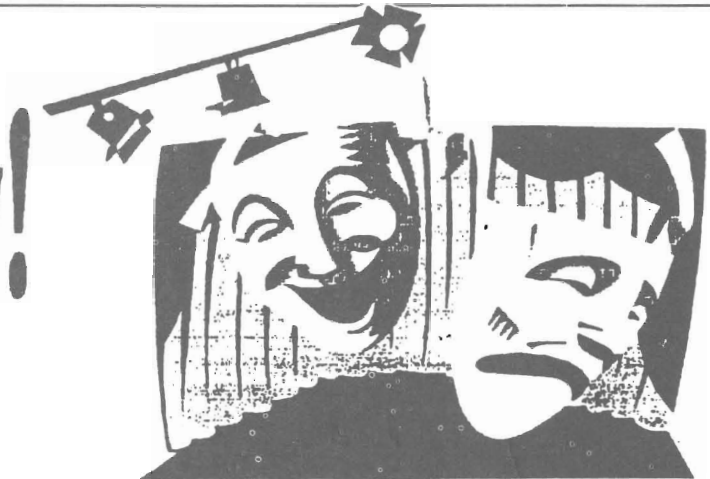

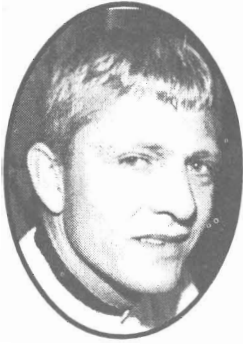
But for my father, the ultimate collaboration was between the people doing the show, and the people they were doing it for.

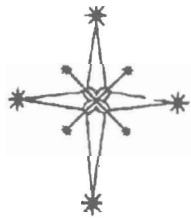
Danielle Jenkins
