Requested Change: Add prerequisite for CDS 5890 – Graduate Thesis

Catalog Wording: Add Prerequisites & Notes section so it would read

Prerequisites & Notes

Open to graduate level degree-seeking CDS majors, prior completion of CDS 5850.

Rationale for Change: Graduate students are required to complete an Independent Study in preparation

for development of a graduate thesis project. This allows the student and a faculty mentor to determine the viability of a proposed topic to meet the rigor required for a graduate thesis. A student who completes CDS 5850-Independent Study may decide not to pursue CDS 5890-Graduate Thesis and opt into the comprehensive examination process for completion of the graduate degree.
