RE: Executive Action Items

The following was approved by executive action at the College of Education and Professional Studies Curriculum Committee meeting on October 26, 2009. I concur with the revision and ask the changes be made by executive action. The effective date should be Fall 2010.

Requested Change: to delete KSS 5220, KSS 5230, and KSS 5700.

~~KSS 5220 – Organization and Administration of Physical Fitness and Cardiac Rehabilitation Programs.~~

~~(2-0-2) The course is designed to provide the student with organizational and administrative direction in planning and implementing adult fitness and cardiac rehabilitation programs.~~

~~KSS 5230 – Physiology of Exercise.~~

~~(3-0-3) A study of the immediate and long range effects of muscular activity upon the respiratory, circulatory, and muscular systems.~~

~~KSS 5700 – Advanced Measurement and Evaluation.~~

~~(3-0-3) Techniques and procedures employed in obtaining anthropometric, metabolic, cardiorespiratory and other physiological data in laboratory and field environments.~~

Rationale for the changes:

KSS 5220 – Similar material is covered in KSS 5450 and KSS 5655.

KSS 5230 – The content covered in KSS 5230 will be covered between the new KSS 5260, KSS 5270, and KSS 5280 classes which will allow for a greater depth and breadth of exercise physiology content in the KSS graduate program.

KSS 5700 – Originally KSS 5700 was developed as a laboratory class for KSS 5230. Some of the material covered in KSS 5700 is currently covered in KSS 4440 and KSS 4450. With the advancement in exercise science laboratory equipment, less time is needed to conduct exercise tests and measurements. Therefore, an entire class such as KSS 5700 is not needed to cover current testing procedures which will now be distributed among KSS 5260, KSS 5270, and KSS 5280.
