ACTION REQUESTED:

We want to modify the current catalog copy of a graduate level course (MBA 5010: Essentials of Accounting) in two minor ways. First, we wish to remove wording from the existing catalog copy that did not allow business students to take the course, and secondly, to add a prerequisite to the course. This prerequisite will require that students taking the course be admitted to the MBA program or other graduate degree programs.

RATIONALE:

Assessment of the MBA program indicates that MBA students need to improve their financial accounting skills. Allowing them to take a combined financial and managerial accounting class will better prepare them for the business world. In addition, a 2009 study by the National Professional Science Master's Association (NPSMA) showed that alumni who graduated from professional science masters programs felt that accounting/finance skills were the fields of study that they most wished that their PSM degree programs could had better assisted them. Thus we would like to allow students in the MBA program and the proposed PSM-GISci program to take MBA 5010 (Essentials of Accounting) as a course in their respective degree programs.
