Communication Disorders & Sciences

Master of Science Online Cohort Program

Rationale: There is a critical shortage of certified speech-language pathologists to fill available positions across the state of Illinois and United States. Admission to graduate programs is limited due to the clinical practicum requirements. Well qualified individuals who have completed undergraduate programs often secure provisional certificates to work in the public schools with a bachelor's degree under the supervision of a certified speech-language pathologist. Matriculation into graduate school becomes more difficult once they are employed and settle into a work setting with family and community ties. An online graduate program would allow them to accumulate graduate hours on a part time basis while employed in the public schools and use summers to complete face-to-face academic requirements.

Aspects of the CDS Online Graduate Cohort Program:

- Graduate program is nationally accredited by the Council on Academic Accreditation; proposed program would meet the same accreditation requirements.
- Cohort program would meet all outcome and formative assessment requirements of the current graduate program.
- CDS is a First Choice graduate program based on the quality standards in current curricular requirements; online cohort would meet the same academic requirements.
- Academic and clinic preparation would be a hybrid of face-to-face, with 49% of the program online and 51% face-to-face; all clinical practicum will be face-to-face supervision.
- Program is a sponsored tuition recovery model (TRM); sponsor would be regional educational office of education.
- All faculty who are scheduled to teach online courses have completed or will complete the EIU training for online course delivery.
- Supervisors who provide on-site practicum will be required to complete a one-day training session on campus to insure compliance with formative assessment and evaluation procedures used in the CDS graduate program. All supervisors must be ASHA certified, licensed, and meet state school certification guidelines.
- Paperwork will include an affiliation agreement to insure the employment site (i.e., public school) is informed regarding expectations of the site; a supervisor agreement to outline expectations and requirements for on-site supervisors of clinical practicum; and a student agreement that delineates student responsibilities for completion of the program.
- States who have implemented similar programs have experienced a significant demand and successful matriculation of students.
- Several grant opportunities are being pursued to assist with funding student tuition and Department expenses associated with the program.

Program Mission: With an appropriate undergraduate major in communication disorders and sciences, this program meets the requirements for the Certificate of Clinical Competence awarded by the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association, the Speech-Language Pathologist license awarded by the Illinois Department of Professional Regulation, and the Type 73 School Service Personnel Certificate awarded by the Illinois State Board of Education.

Accreditation: Council on Academic Accreditation of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association in the area of speech-language pathology.

Admission Requirements: To be eligible for degree candidacy, applicants must meet all of the requirements for admission to the Graduate School (see "Admission to Graduate Degree and Certificate Programs"). Applicants must provide a documented score of the General Test of the Graduate Record Exam. In addition, students must have at least a 3.00 grade point average (A=4.0) in the undergraduate communication disorders and sciences major for admission consideration to the graduate program at Eastern Illinois University. Admission is competitive and meeting minimum GPA requirements does not guarantee admission. Admission is determined by a graduate faculty committee. The committee considers all applications, including transfers from other four-year colleges and universities. With department chair consultation and approval, students may enroll for some courses on a non-degree basis. Students who have a baccalaureate degree in a major other than CDS must complete all 2000 level CDS courses and CDS 3100, 3200, 3500 and 3700 or their equivalents prior to being considered for admission to the CDS graduate program. For the online graduate cohort program, students must be employed in the public schools as a speech-language pathology assistant/paraprofessional, or special education aide; and must meet all other admission criteria.

Study Plan Approval: The study plan shall be filed with the departmental graduate coordinator prior to the completion of 12 semester hours of graduate credit which count toward the graduate degree.

Degree Requirements

Degree requirements include those outlined for the master's degree by the Graduate School (see "Requirements for the Master's Degree").
