## **MEMO**

RE: Proposed Master's in Family and Consumer Sciences online cohort program

DATE: January 13, 2014

During the 2012-2013 AY, the MS in FCS graduate faculty discussed the development of a hybrid program offered specifically to FCS high school teachers. For the past five years, many potential MS in FCS students have expressed interest in an online program. In addition, when at professional conferences within our discipline, many FCS high school teachers have talked to FCS faculty at EIU about the need for an online program so that they could remain employed full time while attending college to obtain their MS in FCS. After the success of the Chicago FCS high school teacher cohort (2008-2010), which was taught to the students at a Chicago location on weekends, the faculty members of the MS in FCS graduate program felt that another hybrid cohort would also be successful and meet the specified needs of current FCS high school teachers.

The proposed program will operate as a cohort, so students that are admitted would progress together through the coursework and comprehensive exams. The program will take seven semesters to complete and the projected start date is July, 2014. Before developing the curriculum for the program, the Graduate Coordinator conducted a needs assessment survey to determine the target audience's (i.e., FCS high school teachers) specific needs. A convenience sample of 15 FCS high school teachers from Illinois, Missouri, and Indiana completed the online survey in the summer, 2013 and the results were used to create a program that would meet the coursework needs expressed by the sample.

The proposed hybrid MS in FCS program will require 36 hours of coursework, including a capstone independent study course and four credits that have to be taken at Eastern Illinois University's campus the first semester. The core program coursework mirrors the MS in FCS program that is currently offered on campus. Currently, the four core courses for the on campus program include FCS 5450 (Supervision and Administration in FCS), FCS 5460 (Issues and Trends in FCS), FCS 5900 (Research Methods in FCS), and FCS 5901 (Statistics in FCS). The proposed hybrid program curriculum excludes the FCS 5450 course so that other critical course content can be included, but includes the other three core courses. The remaining coursework that will be required of the hybrid cohort was developed with the target audience's needs in mind and includes content in five of the FCS disciplines: merchandising, textile design, dietetics, consumer studies, and family services (see Appendix A).

The first six hours of the program (which will launch in the summer, 2014 semester) will include FCS 4838 (Pattern Development and Design), FCS 4753 (Nutrition and the Addicted Person), FCS 5157 (Disordered Eating Behaviors), and FCS 5158 (Childhood Obesity). FCS 4838 and FCS 4753 will be taken on campus. FCS 5157 and FCS 5158 will be administered online. The rest of the coursework will be administered as hybrid (see Appendix B for schedule).

The Graduate Coordinator currently has a waiting list of 25 potential candidates for the first cohort (only 15 students will be admitted at a time) and is working with the School of Continuing Education on the development of a budget and marketing. At this time, we are seeking permission from the LCBAS Curriculum Committee to offer the hybrid MS in FCS cohort program.
