Re: Request for Executive Action from the Department of English

# **Requested Changes:**

To modify the Graduate Certificate for the Teaching of Writing as follows:

- 1. To allow for offering the Certificate's courses (see below) online;
- 2. To add ENG 4765 (Professional Writing) and ENG 5061 A, B, D (Special Topics in Literature and Literary Theory) to the roster of courses that will count towards the Certificate.

#### **Rationale:**

Implemented in Fall 2011, the CTW is an 18-credit hour program, designed primarily for certified teachers of English/Language Arts (at middle and high school levels) to assist them in their professional development in writing pedagogy. The CTW is closely allied with EIU's Summer Writing Institute, a program that works under the aegis of the National Writing Project.

The Department feels that an online CTW:

- Addresses the need for a program to help high school teachers become qualified to teach dual-certification courses (the most frequently asked question from potential students);
- Allows students to complete the certificate in 4 semesters;
- Would provide courses for those teachers (outside English) seeking ELA endorsement;

- Would be marketable across the state (attractive to EIU alumni and non-alumni);
- Will increase enrollment in the MA program—through participation in CTW but also if students decide to continue on for the MA degree (all 18 credit hours will count towards degree).

## **Catalog Language Changes:**

All courses listed below can be offered online as per this Executive Action.

### **Certificate Course/Curriculum Requirements**

All students must complete the following six-credit course:

- ENG 5585 Writing Project for K-12 Teachers Credits: 6
   Students must complete one year of teaching before applying for ENG 5585
- Students must complete a minimum of 12 credit hours of graduate-level courses (5000 and above)

#### **Additional Courses**

Students should choose at least four of the following three-credit courses:

- ENG 4760 Special Topics in Professional Writing Credits: 3 May be repeated.
- ENG 4801 Integrating the English Language Arts. Credits: 3
- ENG 4906 Problems in the Teaching of English Credits: 3 May be repeated.
- ENG 5007 Composition Theory and Pedagogy. Credits: 3
- ENG 5011 Studies in Composition and Rhetoric Credits: 3 May be repeated.
- ENG 5091A Studies in Language, Linguistics, and Literacy Credits: 3 May be repeated.
- ENG 4765 Professional Editing
- ENG 5061A Special Topics in Literature and Literary Theory
- ENG 5061B Special Topics in Literature and Literary Theory
- ENG 5061D Special Topics in Literature and Literary Theory
