# Proposed Reviews Revisions to the online MA in Political Science with the Option in Public Administration and Public Policy

CGS Agenda Item: 18-15 Effective Fall 2018

## **Rationale for Program Revisions**

- 1. We are updating the curriculum to reflect additional courses available in the program:
  - PLS 4763 Environmental Politics and Policy
  - PLS 5900 A-Z Special Topics in Political Science, Public Administration & Public Policy
  - PLS 4763 will count as an elective in Public Administration/Public Policy or in Political Science, but cannot double count. PLS 5900 will count in the elective category appropriate to the course content, and cannot double-count in both categories.
- 2. We are removing the Thesis option for the online program.
  - So far none of our students have selected the Thesis option
  - We believe the Capstone project is a better fit for the online students. The Capstone requires a clear demonstration of content knowledge, critical thinking and writing, research skills, and communication skills, but is more suited to the professional interests of our online students.
  - As a result of this change, the additional coursework hours have been adjusted as well.
- 3. We are changing the research methods requirement for students in the online option.
  - We are deleting PLS 5001 from the curriculum. Some of the content from that 1-credit course will be integrated into the new research methods course, while some will be integrated into our graduate orientation program.
  - We are replacing PLS 5053/Research Methods with PLS 5054/Research Methods in Public Administration and Public Policy.
- 4. We are removing PLS 5997/Study Abroad for the online option.
