Dear Dean Hendrickson,

I write to request that Bess Kosinec Winter, a Unit B faculty member of the English Department, be granted status as an associate member of the graduate faculty, with permission to advise theses and to serve as a thesis reader.

Dr. Winter, as you can see from her CV, is an experienced creative writer and holder of an MFA (in many places considered the terminal degree for creative writers) as well as a PhD. She also has experience editing literary journals, which is important in advising creative writers.

The only reason Dr. Winter is not a Unit A faculty member is that we were not approved to hire in Unit A. She was hired at EIU through a national search that was extremely competitive, and she is as qualified as any first-year tenure-track faculty member we have hired during my time in EIU's English Department.

For students in the MA Literature with Creative Writing emphasis who wish to specialize in fiction, Dr. Winter is an ideal adviser. None of our Unit A creative writing faculty specialize in fiction writing. In order to fully support this track of our MA program, we need to make her available to thesis writing students as a potential primary adviser and as a thesis reader. She is scheduled to teach a graduate course in Spring 2019.
