Proposed Revision to the Communication Disorders & Sciences Master of Science Degree

Requested Changes:

Revise the following courses:

CDS 5000 Research Methods in CDS (Reduced from 2 credit hours to 1)

• Consolidated to focus on methods and data analysis; focus on reading and interpreting articles will be infused in other courses

CDS 5170 Voice Production and Disorders (Reduced from 3 credit hours to 2)

• Removes content related to resonance disorders and cleft palate; moved to CDS 5130

CDS 5250 School Age Language Disorders (remains 3 credit hours)

• Revised to increase emphasis on upper elementary and adolescent language disorders, including social language; integration of intervention for oral and written language

CDS 5300 Aphasia and Right Hemisphere Dysfunction (remains 3 credit hours)

• Revisions to clarify inclusion of content related to right hemisphere disorders

CDS 5350 Cognitive Communication and Executive Function Disorders (Increased from 2 credit hours to 3)

• Embedded content from Executive Functioning Special Topic

CDS 5800 Grand Rounds in CDS (remains 2 credit hours)

• Embedded content from Professional Regulations and Interprofessional Education Special Topic; reduce redundancy of content and align with clinical case studies

CDS 5920 Audiology for the SLP (remains 1 credit hour)

• Updated necessary assessment related content regarding hearing; integrated assessment and diagnosis of (central) auditory processing disorders for SLPs

Add the following new courses:

CDS 5130 Advanced Speech Sound Disorders (2 credit hours)

• Developed to fill a gap in graduate coursework regarding assessment and treatment of articulation and phonological disorders; embeds content on resonance from previous voice class and cleft palate from special topics

CDS 5200 Literacy for the SLP (formerly CDS 5220; Reduced from 3 credit hours to 2)

• Developed (revised and renumbered) to remove some treatment-focused content which will be now be applied in CDS 5230; condensed to reduce demand of summer 6-week course.

CDS 5230 Early Childhood Language Disorders (3 credit hours)

• Developed to fill a gap in graduate coursework regarding assessment and treatment of language disorders in children birth to early elementary age. Integrates intervention for oral and written language disorders.

CDS 5905 Advanced Clinical Treatment and Methodology (1 credit hour)

• Developed to support students' clinical practicum experience in CDS 5900; addresses critical thinking and clinical decision making skills for the provision of skilled therapy services.

CDS 5915 Advanced Clinical Diagnosis and Assessment (1 credit hour)

• Developed to support students' diagnostic practicum experience in CDS 5910; addresses critical thinking for the selection, use, and interpretation of standardized assessments for differential diagnosis of communication disorders.

Delete the following courses:

CDS 5090 Advanced Clinical Techniques (1 credit)

CDS 5091 Advanced Diagnosis of Communication Disorders (1 credit)

CDS 5220 Language and Literacy (3 credits)

CDS 5600 Professional Regulations (2 credits)

Remove:

Hybrid Track for the Master of Science in Communication Disorders & Sciences Requirements for special topics (will now become electives)

Rationale for Changes:

Changes in the graduate program in Communication Disorders & Sciences are proposed to update coursework to align with revised accreditation and certification standards and to minimize the need for makeup coursework for students who receive undergraduate degrees from institutions other than EIU. Special topic courses have been eliminated as a requirement in the program, and key content areas have been integrated into new and revised courses. CDS 5400 will remain in the catalog, to provide flexibility to offer content that may be of interest to graduate students or non-degree students, or to offer course content to meet changing accreditation or certification standards. Given the unsustainable nature of the continuing education/overload model of implementing the Hybrid Track, as well as departmental data indicating discrepancies in performance of students (with Hybrid Track students achieving lower levels of success than students in the Traditional Track), this option has been removed.

Communication Disorders and Sciences

Program Mission: With an appropriate undergraduate major in communication disorders and sciences, this program meets the requirements for the Certificate of Clinical Competence awarded by the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association, the Speech-Language Pathologist License awarded by the Illinois Division of <u>Financial & Professional Regulation</u>, and the K-12 Educator License (with Illinois State Board of Education endorsement). Candidates meeting these requirements are eligible to practice speech-language pathology in both educational and medical settings.

The program offers a single curriculum that includes both a Traditional Track for candidates studying on campus and a Hybrid Track for place-bound candidates who require online access with some on-campus requirements. The curriculum also offers a Special Topics (non-thesis) Option and a Thesis (research) Option.

Accreditation: Council on Academic Accreditation of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association in the area of speech-language pathology.

Admission Requirements: To be eligible for degree candidacy, applicants must meet all of the requirements for admission to the Graduate School (see "Admission to Graduate Degree and Certificate Programs"). To be eligible for admission to the degree program, applicants must provide the following documentation: A documented score of the General Test of the Graduate Record Exam; AT least a 3.00 grade point average (A=4.0) in an undergraduate communication disorders and sciences major.

Traditional Track

- A documented score of the General Test of the Graduate Record Exam;
- At least a 3.00 grade point average (A=4.0) in an undergraduate communication disorders and sciences major.

Hybrid Track

- A documented score of the General Test of the Graduate Record Exam;
- At least a 3.00 grade point average (A=4.0) in an undergraduate communication disorders and sciences major;
- A letter summarizing previous or current relevant work experience with children and/or adults;
- A letter verifying a partnership with a school or clinical setting near the applicant's area of residence that is
 willing to provide the clinical experiences required for the CDS 5900 Advanced Clinical Practice. The
 partnership letter must include evidence of speech language services to children of varying ages with diverse
 disorders.

Students from any accredited four-year college or university who have completed the appropriate undergraduate degree are encouraged to apply. Applicants are advised that admission to the program is competitive and determined by a graduate faculty committee that reviews all applications. Applicants are further advised that before they are eligible for the Educational Internship (CDS 5970) they must obtain a passing score on the Test of Academic Proficiency. Details regarding this requirement are outlined in the *Degree Requirements* section below..

Degree Audit: The graduate plan of study is the EIU Degree Audit, which is generated automatically in the Degree Audit Reporting System (DARS) at the time of degree or certificate candidacy. Modifications of the standard EIU Degree Audit are submitted by the graduate coordinator to the certification officer in the Graduate School at the time modifications are approved. The Degree Audit serves as an unofficial summary of requirements for the program. Degree and certificate candidates are advised to review the comprehensive summary of the Degree Audit process specified on the "Requirements for All Degree and Certificate Candidates" section of the Graduate Catalog. Individual programs may require candidates to submit plans of study in addition to the Degree Audit; candidates should consult with the program coordinator.

Degree Requirements

Degree requirements include those outlined for the master's degree by the Graduate School (see "Requirements for the Master's Degree") and those specified below for the Master of Science in Communication Disorders and Sciences.

Degree candidates for the Master of Science in Communication Disorders and Sciences will complete the following_curriculum sequence detailed below, which includes. The sequence includes all of the courses, clinical practicum, and internship requirements. Candidates typically complete a plan of study arranged over 6 or 7 terms as outlined on the Graduate Program in Speech-Language Pathology section of the Communication Disorders and Sciences website. In addition to the required courses, clinical practicum, and internship requirements, candidates may select from electives including Independent Study. Thesis, and Study Abroad (when offered). Students are also advised that they must meet Essential Functionsfor enrollment in Clinical Fracticum and Internship Experiences. will follow either the Traditional Track or the Hybrid Track. The Traditional Track is arranged over 6 or 7 terms (http://www.eiu.edu/commdisgrad/graduate.php). The Hybrid Track is arranged over 9 terms (http://www.eiu.edu/commdisgrad/GraduateDistanceProgram.php). Finally, candidates will select one of two options; these include either the Special Topics (non-thesis) Option or the Thesis (research) Option.

Special Topics or Thesis Option Requirements

Special Topics Option

Candidates in all tracks selecting the Special Topics Option must complete a total of 4 credit hours of CDS 5400A or CDS 5850 and must pass oral and written comprehensive examinations.

Elective Courses

In addition to the required courses, clinical practicum, and internship experiences, candidates may opt to enroll in electives including Special Topics (when available), Independent Study, CDS Study Abroad (when available), or Thesis. Candidates completing a Thesis must enroll in a total of 4 credit hours of CDS 5890 and must defend and deposit the thesis prior to completion of the degree.

CDS 5400A - Special Topics in Communication Disorders and Sciences Credits: 2

CDS 5850 - Independent Study. Credits: 1 to 4

CDS 5870 – CDS Study Abroad Credits: 2

CDS 5980 – Thesis Credits: 1 to 4

Thesis Option

Candidates in all tracks selecting the Thesis Option must complete a total of 4 credit hours of CDS 5890 and must complete and defend a thesis prior to completion of the degree.

CDS 5890 - Thesis. Credits: 1 to 4

Required Full-Time Internship Experiences

All candidates in all tracks and options are required to complete two internships in two different settings. All candidates complete a Medical Internship and all candidates complete an Educational Internship unless approved to substitute the Clinical Internship as described below.

CDS 5980 - Medical Internship. Credits: 9

All candidates register for 9 semester hours; a maximum of 3 semester hours may be applied to the degree. Candidates are responsible for meeting the requirements of their external medical internship site. Candidates register for 9 semester hours. To be eligible for the Medical Internship candidates must complete the following requirements specific to EIU as well as the external medical internship site:

- Submit and pay for a background investigation
- Provide documentation of a physical exam and immunization records
- Provide proof of professional liability insurance
- Complete and pay for other miscellaneous trainings, orientations, requirement tracking programs, and/or documentation which may be required by the external medical internship site

AND

CDS 5970 - Educational Internship. Credits: 9

All candidates register for 9 semester hours; a maximum of 3 semester hours may be applied to the degree. To be eligible for the Educational Internship candidates must complete the following: requirements:

- Submit and pay for a criminal background investigation
- Submit a passing score on the Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP), or meet approved substitution requirements (http://www.eiu.edu/basicskillstest/actortap.php).
- Provide documentation of the above and complete any other requirements and documentation as necessary for both
 EIU and the educational internship site

Candidates who fail to meet the TAP requirements <u>are not eligible to enroll</u> in the Educational Internship and therefore are not eligible for a K-12 Educator License with Endorsement by the Illinois State Board of Education. Candidates who become ineligible for the Educational Internship must instead complete CDS 5985 Clinical Internship. Candidates in the Hybrid Track must complete their Educational Internship in a school district that is different from the school district in which they completed their Advanced Clinical Practicum (CDS 5900) unless approved by the Educational Internship Coordinator, the Graduate Coordinator, and the Department Chair.

OR

CDS 5985 - Clinical Internship Credits: 9

Candidates approved for Clinical Internship register for 9 semester hours; a maximum of 3 semester hours may be applied to the degree. Clinical Internship (CDS 5985) is available to candidates who do not meet the requirements for Educational Internship (CDS 5970). Candidates completing this approved alternative are not eligible for the K-12 Educator License with Illinois State Board of Education Endorsement.
