Requested Change: Program/Catalog Changes for MSED C&I

Rationale for the change: Due to changes in courses, including new course development, elimination of courses and credit hour changes, the current program and catalog copy do not match available offerings. To that end, we are requesting changes in courses and hours associated with different attributes of the program as noted below. In addition, we are asking for a name change for the “general” option as student feedback has not been positive on the “lack of a name” for that particular emphasis. In addition, we made 2 errors on the Reading emphasis. First, ELE 5400A was included instead of the ELE 5400B course, which is what should have been used. Second, ELE 5650 was inadvertently left off the electives list.

Synopsis of changes:

EDF 5530 – course has been eliminated and replaced by EDF 5560

EDF 5540 – course has been eliminated and replaced by EDF 5560

EDU 5000 – course has been eliminated and replaced by EDU 5050

Add:

EDF 5560 – course was created to combine content from EDF 5530 & 5540 (approved 2018)

EDU 5350 – course was created to assist in fulfilling linguistic requirements outlined by the State, to be used by both the ESL and Reading emphases (approved 2018)

EDU 5050 – course was created to replace the EDU 5000, increasing credit hours and aligning the content to new requirements (approved 2018)

ELE 5650 – Language Arts in the Elementary and Middle School –Reading emphasis
