January 5, 2015	The assignment of a grade by a substantial departure from the faculty member's previously announced standards.	The grounds for grade appeal <u>are not</u> supported and the grade will remain on the student's transcript.
February 22, 2015	The assignment of a grade by application of more exacting requirements than were applied to other students in the course.	The grounds for grade appeal <u>are not</u> supported and the grade will remain on the student's transcript.
