Rationale for Changes: These courses have long been offered face-to-face. As most of our graduate students are practicing teachers, they are seeking more flexibility towards how courses are offered/completed. Moving these courses to an online delivery mode is a step in that direction. The department is also interested in expanding from our local teachers to reaching others in out-lying areas that struggle to come to campus for coursework but would like to further their education.
