1. NUR 4835 – Population-based Healthcare in Nursing.

(2-9-5) On Demand. Epidemiology and concepts related to population-based health with an emphasis on social determinants of health are explored. Knowledge and skills in community assessment, behavior change theory, and the use of information technology will assist students to examine strategies and community-based interventions related to improving the health of populations in rural settings. Inter-professional communication and collaboration will be emphasized as students engage in clinical practicum experiences with individuals, families, and groups. Principles of disaster management and emergency preparedness will be explored at the individual, community, and population level.
