- Revise list of available shared courses for Accelerated MS students seeking entry into the Nutrition Education option of the MS Nutrition and Dietetics.

ACTIONS REQUESTED

Revision of language to:

- Clarify admission process for Accelerated MS students seeking entry into the Dietetic Internship option of the MS Nutrition & Dietetics.
- Create a list of recommended shared courses specifically for students intending to seek entry to the Dietetic Internship option of the MS Nutrition & Dietetics.
- Revise list of available shared courses for Accelerated MS students seeking entry into the Nutrition Education option of the MS Nutrition and Dietetics.

RATIONALE

As department academic advisors began working with our first Nutrition & Dietetics Accelerated MS students this summer, it became clear that clearer guidance and more information was needed, especially for students interested in pursuing entry to the MSND: DI program. For those students to gain full advantage of the Accelerated Program, they need to select their shared courses from a more specific and curated list of choices. In order to better assist academic advisors' and students' understanding of how the Accelerated Program in Nutrition & Dietetics will work and what their curricular choices are, this revision is needed.

CURRENT CATALOG COPY:

Admission to the accelerated MS in Nutrition and Dietetics requires the following:

- a. Early admission into the MSND: Nutrition Education Option.
- b. Completion of a minimum of 75 hours of undergraduate course credit
- c. Completion of a minimum of 15 hours of required Nutrition and Dietetics (NTR) courses.
- d. Minimum undergraduate cumulative GPA of 3.25.

To apply for the Accelerated Program MS in Nutrition and Dietetics, applicants meeting the above requirements must submit the Graduate School's Accelerated Program Application to their undergraduate Academic Advisor and the MSND Graduate Coordinator for review and approval.

Admission to the accelerated MS in Nutrition and Dietetics requires the following:

- Early admission into the MSND: Nutrition Education Option.
- Completion of a minimum of 75 60 hours of undergraduate course credit
- Completion of NTR 2100 with a grade of B or better a minimum of 15 hours of required Nutrition and Dietetics (NTR) courses.
- Minimum undergraduate cumulative GPA of 3.25.
- Approval of the Graduate Coordinator and the Graduate School.

All students seeking admission to the Accelerated MS in Nutrition & Dietetics are initially admitted to the Nutrition Education Option. Students wishing to be admitted to the Dietetic Internship option in order to be eligible to become a Registered/Licensed Dietetic Nutritionist must then complete the DICAS matching process. Once approved and matched by DICAS, students will be moved from the Nutrition Education option to the Dietetic Internship option.

To apply for the Accelerated Program MS in Nutrition and Dietetics, applicants meeting the above requirements must submit the Graduate School's Accelerated Program Application to the Graduate school. their undergraduate Academic Advisor and the MSND Graduate Coordinator for review and approval.
