Re: Request for Executive Action from the School of Communication and Journalism

Action Requested:

Creation of an accelerated M.A. in Communication Studies option.

Rationale:

The accelerated graduate program in Communication Studies will allow interested students to shorten the length of the M.A. program by one semester, providing significant cost savings to students. The accelerated program also serves as a recruitment tool for our undergraduate and graduate programs by allowing us to identify potential graduate students earlier on in their undergraduate education, and by attracting students to our program who might not otherwise have chosen EIU.

Program Admission Requirements:

Admission to the accelerated program in Communication Studies requires that students have a minimum undergraduate cumulative GPA of 3.25 and have completed a minimum of 60 hours of undergraduate course credit. Applicants must have completed a minimum of 15 hours of Communication Studies or Health Communication courses, including at least 9 hours in 3000-4000 level courses. All applicants must submit a personal goals statement, writing sample, and 3 letters of recommendation for consideration.

Students admitted to the accelerated program must meet with the Communication Studies Graduate Coordinator in addition to their undergraduate advisor to select courses each semester.
