RE: Executive Action Taken at the CLAS Curriculum Committee Meeting on Apr 10, 2019

The following request was approved by executive action at the CLAS Curriculum Committee meeting on April 10, 2019. The request would be effective Fall 2019. I ask that similar action be taken at the Council on Graduate Studies.

**Executive Action Request:** To add courses and modify admissions to the Accelerated Graduate program in Political Science

**Rationale:** When we proposed the accelerated program in AY 2017-2018, we expected the greatest demand to be from on-campus Political Science majors. We have found that there is also interest from BGS students, Political Science minors, and on-campus students in related majors. In order to better serve these populations, we are changing the accelerated program to be slightly more flexible:

- Change the requirement of 15 hours of Political Science to allow for some coursework from a complementary undergraduate degree, as determined by the graduate coordinator.
   This change will be assist non-majors and minors in enrolling in the accelerated program.
- 2. Expanding the eligible graduate courses in the accelerated program.
  We began with a restricted list of classes, but due to staffing limitations, and the reality that BGS students with a Political Science minor already have taken nearly all of our online 4750+ graduate courses, we need to offer more options, including all online classes, and more 5000-level classes.
  Again, advisors will support students in selecting the appropriate courses for their study plans.
