

Executive Action: add Accelerated MA in Political Science option for undergraduate students.

Rationale:

The accelerated graduate program in Political Science will allow interested students to shorten the length of the BA/MA process by about one semester, providing significant cost savings to students. Undergraduates will have the opportunity to take challenging graduate level courses, providing a unique learning environment, and introducing more students to earning a graduate level degree.

Program Admission Requirements:

Admission to the accelerated graduate program in Political Science requires that students have a minimum undergraduate cumulative GPA of 3.25 and have completed a minimum of 60 hours of undergraduate course credit. In addition, applicants must have completed (or be concurrently enrolled in) a minimum of 15 hours of Political Science (PLS) courses, including at least 6 credits at the 3000-level. All applicants must submit two letters of reference and a professional goals statement. All enrolled students must meet with the Political Science graduate coordinator in addition to their undergraduate academic advisor to select classes.
