#### RATIONALE:

These changes are requested to align the Management Information Systems and Operations and Supply Chain Management curriculum with other pending curriculum and admission policy changes in the School of Business. "Admission to the School of Business" will no longer be a suitable prerequisite for courses offered. In some cases prerequisites will now require a grade of C or better. These changes would allow students to enroll in some MIS and OSC courses earlier in their degree progress, and allow non-business students who are otherwise qualified to enroll in many of these courses. An effort has been made to provide consistent wording across all the course offerings in the School of Business.

Thus, the management information systems and operations and supply chain management faculty carefully examined all of the management information systems and operations and supply management course prerequisites to ensure that the quality of students and adequate preparation for coursework was maintained.

#### RATIONALE:

These changes are requested to align the Management major curriculum with other pending curriculum and admission policy changes in the School of Business. "Admission to the School of Business" will no longer be a suitable prerequisite for courses offered. In some cases prerequisites will now require a grade of C or better. An effort has been made to provide consistent wording across all the course offerings in the School of Business.

Additionally, the Management faculty carefully examined all course prerequisites in light of the newly available Management minor, with consideration of the best order and timing necessary for successful student achievement and progress in the Management programs. Law courses were carefully examined by the law faculty; all course prerequisites were examined to ensure that the quality of students and the programs are maintained or elevated. The Compensation Management (MGT 4370) course has increasingly followed a strategic Human Resources track that is less focused on legal issues; as such Employment Law (MGT 3900) is not required as a prerequisite, and there is not a problem with students taking these courses concurrently (or varying the order in which these courses are taken). For all changes faculty have prioritized maintaining quality, being considerate of the scheduling needs of students, utilizing faculty resources prudently, and responding to the pending removal of the admission to the School of Business.
