

**ACTIONS REQUESTED:**

1. Change the minimum GPA for majors from 2.0 to 2.5
  - a. As the program focuses exclusively on human services, we are preparing students for entry into the profession or for graduate schools (e.g., social work, clinical counseling, and community leadership). In order to make our students competitive, they need to be able to manage the demands of challenging classes.
  
2. Change the prefix, name, and remove the 9sh option from FCS 4275 Internship in FCS (3, 6, 9 semester hour options) to *HSL 4275 Internship in Human Services Program Administration (3 or 6sh)*
  - 9sh option was predominately used by Hospitality Management students,
  
3. Change the following course prefixes, names/numbers (prefixes also addressed in prior document)
  - Prefix and name of FCS 1800 Life Span Human Development to *HSL 1800 Human Development*
  - Prefix and number of FCS 2800 Family Relationships to *HSL 2820 Family Relationships*
    - Accommodate cross list with *HST 2800 Health Education Research Methods I*

- Prefix and number of FCS 2831 Women and Contemporary Society to *HSL 3831 Women and Contemporary Society*
  - Course content is at the 3000-level
- Prefix and name of FCS 3800 Family Life Sex Education to *HSL 3800 Sexuality Education*
- Prefix and name of FCS 4854 Family Life Education and Community Programming to *HSL 4854 Leadership in Family Life Education*
- Prefix and name of FCS 4859 Administration of Child and Family Life Programming to *HSL 4859 Administration of Youth and Family Services Programs*

**RATIONALE:** Family & Consumer Sciences was realigned Fall 2018 and is no longer a stand-alone program. The FCS Family Services option is now in the Department of Human Services and Community Leadership in the College of Health and Human Services. FCS Family Services initiated a name change to Human Services Program Administration, and corresponding courses and requirements have been revised to align with the focus of the new department and revised degree.

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***HSL 4275 – Internship in Human Services Program Administration.***

(Arr.-Arr.-3-6) (Credit/No Credit) An individually-planned work experience in a business or agency appropriate to the student's area of specialization. May be repeated once.

HSL 4200, junior standing, permission of the Chair of the department of Human Services and Community Leadership, good academic standing at time of registration, and acceptance of the student by a business or agency. Credits: 3 to 6
