The Foundational Pillars of the EIU Experience

I'm Edwyn Mitchell, and I am proud to say: Spring Class of 2019, we made it. To say that today is the day that we have all dreamed of is, to say the least, an understatement. Because we did far more than just dream; we executed. We set goals, created dynamic plans to achieve them, worked diligently, and pushed ourselves to our limits. Today is the day when we collectively share the experience of a lifetime. In this speech, I will share aspects of my personal story, but I want each and every one of you to reflect on your personal experience as well, because I believe all of our journeys have been founded on three pillars which are foundational to the Eastern Illinois University experience: accessibility, opportunity, and connection.
