POLAR PLUNGE 2023

The Eastern Illinois University Glow Polar Plunge was held on Sunday, February 26 at 6pm, with 73 brave EIU Students, Faculty, and community members taking the cold plunge on behalf of Special Olympics Illinois. These amazing polar plungers raised \$12,550 for Special Olympics Illinois, which provides FREE year-round sports trainings, competitions, health programs, family fun events, and leadership education to our local Special Olympics Athletes. Dr. Jay Gatrell, EIU Provost, and future University President, was the emcee for this year's event, in addition to winning the Golden Plunger award for raising the most funds.

The EIU Department of Special Education Plunge team was able to raise the most funds as a team and is currently in first place to win the Special Olympics Illinois Region I College Cup, which provides \$1000 back to the College group that raised the most funds.

Eastern Illinois University is a leader in the inclusion revolution and is a National Unified Champion College for Special Olympics Illinois. Description: Yoga is known to provide such physical benefits as increased muscle tone, improved mobility and flexibility of the joints, and enhanced balance and coordination, but this course will also explore yoga as a method of practicing mindful awareness to further enrich well-being. As a form of meditation, mindfulness helps us manage how we react to the stress, uncertainty, anxiety, and difficulties that surround us. Participants will be invited to slow down and pay close attention to their minds and bodies as they are guided through a series of gentle movements, breathing exercises, and relaxation techniques. As nature is an intrinsic component of yoga, this class will embrace that theme by meeting outdoors, further enhancing the calming effects of yoga and meditation on the nervous system. Please wear comfortable clothing that is easy to move in and weather appropriate, bring a mat, rug, or blanket, and drinking water.
