Program Revision Request: Exercise Science (B.S.)

Summary of requested changes, with rationale:

Core Requirements

Add KSS 4274 – Pre-Internship in KSS. Credits: 1

Identification, selection and securing of an internship site are critical components of the student's overall success with the internship experience. This course will better equip students for all aspects of the internship experience through identification of professional strengths, expectations of the internship and alignment with departmental objectives. A variety of professional development topics will be included in the course.

- Remove HST 3110 First Aid/CPR/AED for the Health and Fitness Professional.
 Credits: 4
 - The Department of Health Promotion is supportive of this request.

Footnotes

- Require Exercise Science major students to show proof of Adult First Aid/CPR/AED certification prior to KSS 4275 – Internship.
 - The National Strength & Conditioning Association (NSCA) Education Recognition Program requires students to possess this certification. The NSCA has approved the program requirement to show proof of certification, in the absence of curricular content.
 - Certification can be acquired off campus at a much lower cost.
- Limit the number of times an Exercise Science major student can take 3000 and 4000level KSS courses.

A grade of C or better is required in BIO 2210, BIO 2220 and all Kinesiology and Sports Studies courses counting toward the major.

Exercise Science major students must show proof of Adult CPR/AED/First Aid certification prior to enrollment in KSS 4275 – Internship.

Exercise Science major students may receive a grade in 3000 and 4000-level Kinesiology and Sports Studies courses a maximum of two times. After a grade has been recorded in a 3000 or 4000-level KSS course at EIU, the Department of Kinesiology and Sports Studies will not accept subsequent transfer of an equivalent course from another institution unless the KSS department has given prior written approval to enroll in the specific course at the specific institution. If after a second grade has been recorded for a given course and the student has not received a grade of C or better, the student will not be allowed to continue as an Exercise Science major and shall consult with his or her advisor to select a different major. Student appeals shall follow the procedures described in the EIU Grade Appeal Policy.
