RE: Change in CTE-Family Consumer Science Education Program

**Action requested:**

We will be asking for executive action that the following courses be removed from the CTE- Family Consumer Sciences Education program (the courses will still be available for student to take, but not required of the program) listing in the catalog under the heading of Secondary Education Program - Total 42 hours (with the proposed change).

The courses that would be removed from the listing would be:  
MLE 3110 Curriculum and Instruction in Middle-Level School  
MLE40001 Practicum in Middle School Curriculum & Instruction  
MLE 3150 Interdisciplinary teaching in the middle-level school

The MLE class that would remain in the requirements would be MLE 4670 Student Social-Emotional Development in the Middle Grades.

**Rationale:**

It has been brought to our attention that with the change in state requirements, not all the MLE courses listed in the catalog under Family and Consumer Science Education will need to be included as currently listed in the Secondary Education program. This modification would bring the requirements parallel with those in Business Education and Technology Education. We will be asking for executive action that the following courses be removed from the CTE- Family Consumer Sciences Education program (the courses will still be available for student to take, but not required of the program) listing in the catalog under the heading of Secondary Education Program - Total 42 hours (with the proposed change).
