Graduate

Awards

Conference Presentations/Panels (Peer Reviewed)

In April, **Amanda Feder** presented "Fighting Business with Business: The Construction of the Vulnerable and Exploited Third World Woman in the Not for Sale Campaign" at the Central States Communication Association Conference (CSCA). The paper examined the construction of the "vulnerable Third World Woman" by communicative labor of the Not for Sale Campaign. A month later, **Amanda** presented "On the Edge: Breaking Down the Borders of Agenda Setting in Relation to the Femicides of Ciudad Juárez" at the Rhetoric Society of America (RSA) Conference in San Antonio, Texas.

At the CSCA conference, **Nate Furstenau** presented "Maternity Leave as a Site of Difference: A Consideration for Mothers and Families."

At the RSA conference, **Ethan Kruger** participated on a paper panel entitled, "Approaches to the Rhetoric of War." Focusing on presidential rhetoric, **Ethan's** paper, "Ideological War: Presidential Rhetoric Creating Borders" suggested criteria for a new "conflict" genre of presidential rhetoric based on Cold War and War on Terror speeches.

Emily Vajjala presented two papers at the CSCA conference: "Beauty and Gender Ideologies: How the Miss Universe Pageant Perpetuates Feminine Stereotypes" and "Colonializing Factors in Internet Rhetoric: Postcolonial and Transnational Feminist Themes from the Reporting of the Murder of Kapari Leniata."

Three graduate students attended the ICTA conference in September. **Stephanie Gruner**, **John Kraps**, and **Emily Vajjala** participated on a panel that explored new ideas for teaching the basic course.
