Subject:	Executive Action on Current Application of Credit in the English Major (B.A.) Program for ENG 2009G (2099G) and ENG 2011G (2091G)

As a result of recent changes in the Illinois Articulation Initiative, students who transfer to EIU from community colleges can double count up to 9 semester hours of sophomore English literature. The community college sophomore British and American survey courses transfer for general education credit as well as count as electives within our major. To provide parity across the major, and beginning Fall 2011, native EIU English majors will be allowed to double count English 2009G (2099G) and 2011G (2091G). Because of this change and to ensure the required completion of 40 hours at the 3000 level or above, English majors (non-teacher certification) will be required to select 2 of the 5 elective courses at the 3000 level or above.

This change was approved by the Department of English on April 27, 2011. Because these changes require only articulation in the catalog copy, and because these changes do not apply to the Teacher English Language Arts Option for Teacher Certification (B.A.), I request that these changes be approved as an executive action.

Revised April 10, 2012 (to clear up unintended confusion caused by crossed-out language): This change applies to both the English BA program and the English Language Arts Option for Teacher Certification BA program.

The revised catalog language is listed below (in red) following the original copy.

English Electives (15 credits)

Five additional courses in English, chosen from any of the above or from Group 5. General Education courses are excluded, except for 3009G/3099G. Two courses in a single foreign language may be counted if numbered 2000 or above, not taught in English, and not offered for Gen Ed credit.

Revised: Five additional courses in English, chosen from any of the above or from Group 5. General Education courses are excluded, except for ENG 2009G/ENG 2099G, ENG 2011G/ENG 2091G, and ENG 3009G/ENG3099G. English majors (non-teacher certification) are required to select 2 of the 5 elective courses at the 3000 level or above. Two courses in a single foreign language may be counted if numbered 2000 or above, not taught in English, and not offered for Gen Ed credit.

(Major GPA based on all English courses taken at EIU except ENG 0990, 0995, 1000, 1001G, 1002G, 1091G, 1092G, and General Education courses other than ENG 2009G/ENG 2099G, ENG 2011G/ENG 2091G, and ENG 3009G/ENG3099G.)
