V. <u>Teacher Education Update and Executive Director's Report</u>

House Bill 3022 has been withdrawn thanks to the Illinois State Board of Education. This bill
would have required schools to conduct a criminal background investigation on students prior
to student teaching. Given the fact that more and more schools are requiring fingerprinting
results prior to allowing students into their school for observations and practicum, a proposal
is being developed to change how we conduct the criminal background investigations for our

students. The proposal should be ready to add to the December 6 agenda with discussion and voting to take place at the January 10 meeting.

- Effective July 2012 (beginning with Fall 2012 student teaching), the Assessment of Professional Teaching (APT) test becomes a requirement for graduation and teacher certification program completion.
- **3.** Teacher Performance Assessment (TPAC) This program will start being phased in beginning in 2013 and become effective in 2015.
- 4. The redesign of teacher education programs to meet the new Illinois Professional Teaching Standards is continuing. Dr. Lucas and the Department of Secondary Education and Foundations will hold meetings on November 28, 29, and 30 to discuss the potential redesign for secondary programs.
