V. <u>Items to be Acted Upon</u>

1. Criminal History Check Requirement Process Revision

Recommend changes be made to the first paragraph for students who may have completed a fingerprint-based criminal history check with another higher education institution (Community College or University) or a K-12 school within the past 12 months. They may use the results for the first background check requirement. A copy of the Illinois State Police Criminal History report must be mailed/delivered to the Dean's Office, College of Education and Professional Studies, 1420 Buzzard Hall, Charleston, IL 61920 in an official (letterhead), sealed envelope from

the institution who received the original results. The second criminal history check must be conducted no later than mid-term of the semester prior to student teaching. These changes should be effective for Spring 2014 semester.

VI. <u>Teacher Education Update/Executive Director's Report</u>

- 1. Dr. Bower reported that an email was sent out on December 9, 2013 to faculty and staff as to the state making changes to the processing of the Form 7360. The changes will take effect January 2014. Students will now be able to create an account on ELIS to send in their ACT Scores. The CEPS Dean's Office will be able to go online and verify that students do meet the requirements. The requirements are the same, only the process has changed.
- 2. Dr. Bower reported that the state is also changing the content-based exams from a paper-pencil format to a computer-based format. By 2015 all content-based exams will be online. The cost will still remain the same, at this point. Additional locations for weekend exams are still being sought around the state, current testing sites are very limited.
- 3. Dr. Bower reported that the state is also looking to add a writing score requirement (English/Writing combined) in addition to the ACT composite requirement for individuals using the ACT in lieu of the TAP. It may take six to nine months before implementation.
- 4. Dr. Bower reported that all program reports were submitted to the state on time and will be reviewed in January.
- 5. Dean Jackman reported that all applicants for the COST program have been interviewed. If a student asks for a letter of recommendation, please get them done as quickly as possible as there are deadlines that must be met.
- 6. Thirteen new video cameras have been purchased for all of the Student Teaching Coordinators to use in the schools.
- 7. Dr. Bower reported that there will be new catalog language changes coming in the near future. Some changes include removing the certification language to read licensure or endorsement.
- 8. Dean Jackman reported that all the Student Teaching Coordinators have been busy in the schools and have been working with the new edTPA requirements. All coordinators will be on campus at the end of January for a meeting. There will be a social on January 29th at 4:00 p.m.
- 9. Dean Jackman reminded everyone about the Fall Commencement Ceremony that will be held on Saturday, December 14, 2013 at 1:00 p.m. Please encourage faculty to attend. They need to be present by 12:00 p.m. The Special Education Department will host their honors ceremony before the 1:00 p.m. commencement ceremony.
