Rationale: Since 2009, there has been a sharp decline in the number of students enrolled in the School Health (teacher licensure) option of the major which mirrors the decline in the number of teacher licensure students across campus. As the table below indicates, numbers in the major have dropped substantially:

Students Enrolled: School Health Option

Given the current economic exigencies, it is not economically feasible to continue to offer an academic major program which only serves 2 students.

We will continue to offer the School Health (Health Studies with Teacher Licensure) minor which will allow students to supplement a teacher licensure major with the necessary qualifications to teach health at the secondary level. This will also provide a barometer of interest in School Health teacher licensure. At such time that it appears there is sufficient interest to warrant it, we will submit the School Health program through the curriculum approval process, and reinstate it to our major.
