- 1. The edTPA submissions for Fall 2016 student teachers were finished up today. The first set of results should be received on November 3. The remaining results should be received on November 17.
- 2. We are in the process of making final placements for Spring 2017 student teaching.
- 3. Applications for 2017-2018 student teaching are due on Monday, October 31.
- 4. The Fall 2016 Education Job Fair will be held on November 2.
- 5. Dean Jackman offered congratulations to Dr. Laughlin-Schultz on a successful History Teacher conference that was held last week.
- 6. The interviews for Assistant Vice President for Enrollment Management were wrapped up this week.
- 7. For our next COTE meeting, Dean Jackman asked members to speak with their students to find out what attracted them to Eastern Illinois University. This information will be helpful in future recruitment endeavors.
- 8. We are working toward our next CAEP visit that is scheduled for Fall 2017. However, we have requested an extension to Spring 2018 and hope to hear about that very soon. Plans are to set up some committees around three of the standards: 1) our recruitment plan for teacher education; 2) our clinical partnerships; and 3) gathering information from in-service teachers on their performance. ### ATTACHMENT A Social Science Teaching (B.A.)

#### Standard High School Certificate\*

The Social Science Teaching Major is designed to meet the needs of students who wish to teach Social Studies subjects in Illinois secondary schools. The major's disciplinary curriculum consists of courses in the social sciences (economics, geography, history, political science, psychology, sociology and anthropology). Students must receive a grade of "C" or higher in all courses which apply to the major and must maintain a major grade point average of 3.0 or higher and a cumulative grade point average of 2.75 or higher to complete the program. For students also wanting to be eligible to teach in the middle school, additional Middle Level Education courses are required.

The Social Science Teaching Major comprises

- 40 hours of general education (Note: Some courses required by the Social Science Teaching major meet general education requirements, so only 21-28 additional general education hours are actually required. See specific designation for details.);
- 2. 34 hours in the professional education core (Regular program: SED 2000, EDF 2555G, SED 3330, EDP 2330, SED 4330, EDF 4550, SPE 3500, STG 4000, STG 4001;
- 3. <del>72-80</del> 67-68 hours in major courses dependent upon the designation chosen</del> (see courses listed below under "Required Major Courses" for each designation).

This major requires that students follow and meet the requirements for Admission, Retention, and Graduation from Teacher Licensure programs as described in the <u>Teacher Licensure Programs</u> section of this catalog and as explained at the University Admission to Teacher Education Meeting which all students must attend. Students must gain University Approval to Take Teacher Education Courses no later than the end of their first semester junior year in order to use this suggested plan. Additional information on Admission, Retention and Graduation for Teacher Licensure programs can be found on the College of Education & Professional Studies website at <u>http://www.eiu.edu/ceps/teached</u>.

All students must pass the Illinois Licensure Test of Academic Proficiency or document a composite score of 22 or higher, with combined English/Writing score of 19/Writing Subtest score of 16, on the ACT plus Writing for selection into teacher education and should complete this requirement no later than their sophomore year.

Students must receive a "C" or better in all courses used toward graduation, regardless of where they are taken. This includes general education, professional education, major and minor courses, all university required courses, and electives. Students must maintain a minimum cumulative and major GPA of 2.65 in order to continue in the education program. Students must receive a "C" or better in all coursework, and maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75 and major GPA of 3.00, in order to be approved for student teaching. Approval for student teaching requires that the minimum GPA be held at the beginning of the semester prior to the student-teaching semester. Students must also pass the requisite state content test in order for student teaching approval.

Students must complete the professional education coursework following the Regular Secondary Education Professional Education Course Sequence. Information is also available in the Teacher Licensure Program section of this catalog.
