Requested Change: New emphasis in the Curriculum and Instruction MSEd program leading to Middle Grades entitlement at the graduate level

Rationale for the change: The process to achieve a Middle Grades endorsement for graduate students has recently (January 31) changed. Our proposal is to create a graduate level focused program in order to serve the graduate population needing/desiring a middle grades endorsement. The proposed program will fulfill the professional coursework sequence.

No new coursework was created for this emphasis, as all courses currently exist; they simply had not been put together in this type of sequence.

- 2. Pass Middle Grades state content test(s)
- 3. Demonstrate effective teaching by:
 - a. Submitting an evaluation that provides evidence of one successful year of teaching, as reviewed by the Eastern Illinois University Licensure Officer

OR

- b. Completing student teaching at Middle Grades
