PD Sessions will be offered online with Zoom for remote attendance. Some sessions may have an in-person option available along with the Zoom Room. Each session will be approximately one hour in length. The presenters will be experts in the field on each topic with a general discussion, examples, and how-to steps demonstrated. A session typically will be facilitated by EIU-RSI with about two presenters sharing their experience and knowledge. Every session will have opportunity for participants to practice and to ask questions.
