Dr. Methven noted the Council on Graduate Studies had requested CAA delay action on this item until CGS had an opportunity to discuss the items at their March 5 meeting. The Council agreed to do so. Dr. Dietz presented the format and answered questions of the Council. A discussion of the draft format followed and the Council requested that Dr. Dietz make revisions to the draft and forward it to the Chair and CGS.

The Council also decided to strike the last sentence from the New/Revised Course Proposal Format (approved February 7, 2002 by CAA) under 4.d. "If the course, or sections of the course,

may be technology delivered, how will the program(s) involved be affected (for example, course availability, number of available seats, program access, etc.).”



- 02-14, Revision in Semester Overload Policy.

Dean Hitch presented the proposal and answered questions of the Council. Dr. Shonk proposed and Dr. Helsel seconded an amendment to the proposal to make the 2.5 GPA requirement consistent for all seniors. The amendment was adopted unanimously.

The Council then voted on the amended proposal. The amended proposal was passed unanimously.
