


What is a video note?


A video note is a brief video clip that you can record within a course in D2L without the need for special software or downloading/uploading files.

Where can a video note be recorded and used?

You can record a video note anywhere that you have access to the **HTML editor** within a course.




What is the HTML editor in D2L?



The HTML editor is available in:























Where do we recommend using video notes?

Video notes work well when you want to provide immediate feedback to a student or a group of students or wish to convey a quick reminder or announcement.



Example use cases for video notes:






Build and foster instructor presence in a **news** announcement.

Provide an introduction to a module or topic or assigned activity in course **content**.

Example use cases for video notes:



Increase student engagement in **discussion** posts or replies.




Provide students with additional information or guidance in assignment feedback.



Can I edit a video note?

• A Video Note cannot be edited but you can easily re-record.


How do I re-record a video note?




- If you don't like the video after you have recorded, simply select "New Recording" to re-record.
- If you have already inserted the video, delete it and create a new video note.

How do I delete a Video Note?

- Edit the item where you inserted the Video Note.
- Click in the blank area to the right of the video note.
- press <Backspace> on your keyboard to delete it.




Is a video note accessible?



- Yes, provided you choose to generate captions for your video note.
- However, the captions cannot be edited.
- If you include a description, the text is accessible to students using assistive software to read their screen.

Can I (or my students) download a video note?

No. Video note downloading is not available in D2L.



Note: If you are viewing a video note in a content page, you will see a download button; however, this button does not allow you to download the video file.

Can I search for and reuse my Video Notes?



Example:

- If you have recorded a video that you want to add to a news announcement in several of your courses.
- You can record it in one course, then easily search for and add it to news announcements in your other courses.




Do Video Notes copy from one section to another?

Yes. Though video notes are **not** a part of your course files, they will copy when you copy content from one course to another using the Import/Export/Copy function.

Can students record Video Notes?

Yes. Students can record video notes in any location where they have access to the HTML editor assuming they have a working microphone and camera on their computer or device.







Suggested Practice

- Before requiring students to record video notes within a graded discussion, set up a "Video Note Practice" discussion topic first.
- They can test their technology and get assistance ahead of time if needed.



Provide detailed instructions

- Students might not be familiar with the HTML editing toolset available to them in discussions and assignments.
- They might not already know, for example, what the Insert Stuff tool looks like.
- They will need step-by-step directions the first time that you ask them to complete a discussion activity or assignment using video note.

Adding a Video Note using Insert Stuff vs. "Record Video" option

Recommended Adding a Video Note

 Create a video note using Insert Stuff in the HTML editor.





• Video embedded within D2L.

NOT Recommended Record Video Option

- Record Video option in the "Attachments" area.
- Attaches an HTML file with a link to the video
- Requires the viewer to download and open the file, then, click on the link to see the video.
- Video notes recorded as attachments are also much less accessible to students with visual impairments.

Alternative to Video Note

Kaltura Express Capture

- pared-down version of Kaltura Personal Capture
- record video within D2L without additional software
- has auto captioning and the captions can be edited
- Insert Stuff > Add Kaltura Media > Add New > Express Capture
- video automatically saved to "my media" in Kaltura
- log into Kaltura to request transcript and edit transcript

Tips for recording effective videos

- Have a plan for what you are going to say
 - brief outline
- Audio quality matters
 - test your microphone
 - eliminate background noise
- Length can impact effectiveness
 - keep it short and to the point including just enough relevant information

Project a good webcam image

- Front lighting
- Position the camera above your eyes, so you look slightly up at it. Avoid looking down at the camera.
- Eye contact/look into the camera
- Keep background uncluttered
- Cover your screen or hide your image if necessary so you're not distracted by seeing yourself while you record.
- Smile
