Changes and/or improvements in curriculum, instruction, and learning will be implemented as a result of discussing the data collected over the last year.

- 1. We manage COVID and adjusted practicum/internship experiences to meet CACREP standards.
- 2. Taught online effectively as evidenced by the objectives that were met.
- 3. Participated in workshops on telehealth.
- 4. Job placements during the pandemic were excellent
- 5. Retention was strong.
- 6. In addition the following data will be shared with faculty at the upcoming fall retreat:
 - Admissions: Based on the data, our admission process worked well considered all recruitment efforts and admission interviews were online. Using the admission rubrics and extensive interview process, we are able to select candidates that meet our objectives and ensure our learning community thrives. We will continue working on strategic action items during recruitment to ensure strong and diverse pool.
 - Depth of Content GPA, Key Performance Indicators, Course Assessments, Exams:
 - 1) 3.0 GPA was maintained by students currently enrolled in the counseling program.
 - Data collected indicated most of the course objectives were perceived as met.
 Counseling students obtained 85% pass rate with 3 students failing the NCE exam. All three plan to retake at the next opportunity.
 School students obtained 100% pass rate on the PEL.
 Students obtained 94% pass rate on the comp exam in the fall and 100% pass rate for those students who took it in the spring.

- Professional Dispositions Objective 3: We spend considerable time ensuring our students maintain a professional disposition throughout the program. The remedial process we have in place is working given that most of the students flagged with a warning were asked to enter our retention phase and three were put on a formal remedial plan. We had three students who entered our warning phase and one student was asked to leave the program and two were suspended and asked to reapply the following year.
- Critical Thinking and Problem Solving Based on Practicum and Internship supervisor surveys (5630, 6902, and 6922), students met or exceeded expectations on both the core CACREP components and global indices.
- Oral and Written Communication: Based on data collected from Professional Orientation (5510 ethics paper), Cross Cultural Counseling 5600 Cultural Interview), and Career Counseling (5920 Theory Paper), the majority of students met or exceeded expectations on both oral and written communication.
- Scholarship and Research: Counseling students are doing very well in their understanding of Scholarship and Research. 92% of the student met or exceeded expectations on the Research Proposal (CHE 5500). We had 100 percent of our tested students exceed the national mean scores on the NCE. We had a 94% pass rate in the fall and 100% pass rate in the spring on the comprehensive exam. Student agreed that course objectives in CHE 5500 were met. Lastly, based on the Internship Supervisor survey (items 8a and 8b) and the Practicum Supervisor survey (item 8), student met or exceeded expectations. What is interesting is that 62% of the Internship respondents did not observe interns in regards to their knowledge or practice of research. Given the practical nature of internship, perhaps this fact is not surprising. We will informally survey supervisors to see if research and appraisal can be better incorporated into their practica/internships.
- > Based of feedback from the data from this report including the survey data, the following action items were created:
 - 1. Review objective measurements for the SLAP to see if they capture what we want to measure
 - 2. Continue to manage COVID impact on lecture courses and practicum/internship.
 - 3. Explore Telehealth to see how it might be incorporated into courses.
 - 4. Develop a new training video for supervisors to view who are new to supervision of practicum/intern students.
 - 5. Discuss options for including more Special Ed. into school counseling courses.
 - 6. Discuss with practicum/internship supervisors ways to incorporate appraisal and program evaluation as part of the students' experience.

Learning Objectives	The objectives for the program encompass all the graduate learning goals established by EIU's Council on Graduate Studies.
How, Where, and When Assessed	The assessment plan is clear. There seems to be a rigorous admission process, where students are assessed at entry. Throughout the program, surveys are used to assess students' perception of the learning goals. Student disposition is monitored throughout the program with plans in place for students who are not in good standing. The plan also includes comprehensive exams, certifications exams, and surveys of internship supervisors. In the last semester of the program, students complete an exit survey.
Expectations	Expectations are included and seem reasonable.
Results	The program is meeting nearly all assessment goals. For some of the classes less than 75% of the students felt that the learning goals were being met, (particularly CHE 5900, CHE 5970). All students maintained the required G.P.A.; the internship supervisors overall felt students were well-prepared, almost all students passed the NCE exam, and all those who took it, passed the school licensing exam.
How Results Will be Used	There is a process in place to identify and support students who fall out of good standing. The Chair collects the data and creates the report, and shares with all faculty for discussion. This is a good use of the findings.
Recommendations	The assessment plan is strong in that students are assessed before entry and observed throughout the curriculum. The way you are using the information to improve the program shows your commitment to the students and the success of program. The self-assessments completed by the students seem to be helpful in identifying classes that may not be meeting learning objectives, and those are discussed with faculty. We recommend continuing the process of sharing and discussing the results with the entire faculty for improvements. The feedback from the internship supervisors highlights how well you prepare your students before allowing them to practice in the field. And the 100% pass rate on the school licensing exam, and nearly 100% pass rate on the NCE exam demonstrates the thoroughness of the program.

The Council on Graduate Studies approved of revised learning goals on December 8, 2020, which included the addition of an Ethical and Professional Responsibility learning goal. Please
