Dear Residential Life Staff:

On behalf of the Brad Wright Memorial Foundation and the Residence Hall Association, the University Housing and Dining Services Department is now accepting nominations for the **Brad Wright Memorial Scholarship**. Brad Wright was from Decatur, Illinois. Brad served as a Resident Assistant in Carman Hall from 1997-98. Brad was planning on returning as a Resident Assistant for the following fall semester, but on June 28, 1998, Brad passed away due to an undetected heart condition. This scholarship was created by the friends and family of Brad Wright as a testament to his legacy.

This is one of Housing and Dining's prestigious scholarships recognizing outstanding contributions to our on-campus students and housing program by a Resident Assistant or Senior Staff Assistant. Nominations may be made by any Professional Housing Staff member, with a limit of one per staff member. Self-nominations will not be accepted.

Before nominating an individual, they must meet the below criteria:

1. Be an undergraduate, full-time or part-time EIU student, enrolled at EIU during the semester of nomination.
2. Be currently employed as a Resident Assistant or Senior Staff Assistant in EIU Housing for a minimum of one semester, before or including the semester of nomination.
3. Have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75 at the end of the last semester before nomination.
4. Recipient must be a full-time undergraduate in the fall semester that the award is paid and must be a returning student staff member for the following fall semester.

To nominate a student leader:

1. Submit a letter of nomination through our MachForm on our website located at http://www.eiu.edu/housing/hsgscholar_nom.php. Nomination letters are due by **March 3, 2023**, at 4:30pm.

After the letter of nomination is received:

1. **Before March 10, 2023**, an on-line application for the scholarship will be sent to the nominee via their Eastern Illinois University email address.
2. Nominees must complete the on-line application at http://www.eiu.edu/~housing/hsg_scholar.php by 4:30 pm on **April 7, 2023**.
3. This award will be presented to this year's recipient at the Residential Life Closing Banquet on **Monday, April 24, 2023**.

Career in Housing and Student Affairs Scholarship

Dear Residential Life Staff:

University Housing and Dining Services is now accepting nominations for the Bailey, Geninatti, Johnson, Morrissey, Swanson Residence Hall Scholarship, hereafter referred to as the **Career in Housing and Student Affairs Scholarship**. A former Hall Director and four Resident Assistants from the 1975-1976 formerly named Douglas Hall staff put together this scholarship to encourage students to pursue a career in Housing/Student Affairs. This is a prestigious scholarship recognizing the contributions of an undergraduate Student Staff Member who has served Eastern Illinois University's Residential Life Program and has a desire to pursue a career in housing or Student Affairs. Self-nominations may be made by any individual who meets the criteria.

Before nominating an individual, they must meet the below criteria:

1. Applied and been accepted as a degree seeking candidate pursuing a Bachelor's Degree at Eastern Illinois University.
2. Be returning to an executive board position or residential life student staff position for the next academic semester.
3. Commit to being active in leadership for both the following fall and spring semester.
4. Reside in University Housing at the time of nomination, as well as the following year that the scholarship is awarded (exception being if the student is student teaching).
5. Engage in student affairs work within their department as a condition of the scholarship. This could include, but not limited to performing weekly duties while serving as a Resident Assistant/Senior Staff Assistant or completing other duties as assigned by the Director of Housing and Dining if the person is not serving in a housing staff position.
6. Must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or above.
7. Plan to seriously pursue a career in Student Housing/Student Affairs.

There will be a preference given in priority order as follows:

Undergraduate students who have served as an executive board member in hall council, RHA, or NRHH or as an Resident Assistant/Senior Staff Assistant during their undergraduate programs

To nominate a student leader:

1. Submit a letter of nomination through our MachForm on our website located at http://www.eiu.edu/housing/hsgscholar_nom.php. Nomination letters are due **March 3, 2023, by 4:30pm.**

After the letter of nomination is received:

1. **Before March 10, 2023**, an on-line application for the scholarship will be sent to the nominee via their Eastern Illinois University email address.
2. Nominees must complete the on-line application at http://www.eiu.edu/~housing/hsg_scholar.php by 4:30 pm on **April 7, 2023**.

University Housing and Dining Services is accepting nominations for the **Richard G. Enochs Scholarship**. This scholarship is a prestigious Housing Scholarship recognizing the contributions of an outstanding student leader in our on-campus community. Nominations may be made by any Housing Professional Staff member, with a limit of one nomination per staff member.

Richard Enochs was the director of married student housing for Eastern until his untimely passing on March 5, 1978. Friends and representatives of the Housing and Dining Office honored the memory of Mr. Enochs by establishing the Richard G. Enochs Scholarship on June 5, 1978.

Before nominating an individual, they must meet the below criteria:

1. Be a sophomore, junior, senior, or graduate student without a graduate assistantship at Eastern and have a stated intention of returning to the university for the fall semester following the date of their selection.
2. Reside in University Housing at the time of nomination, as well as the following semester of the following academic year.
3. Have outstanding personal character and be a student of scholastic achievement.
4. Have demonstrated achievement in terms of his or her contribution to the student housing program.

Louis V. Hencken Housing Service Scholarship

Dear Residential Life Staff:

University Housing and Dining Services is now accepting nominations for the **Louis V. Hencken Housing Service Scholarship**. This scholarship is a prestigious Housing Scholarship recognizing the past academic year contributions of outstanding student leaders, especially in Panther L.E.A.D.S. who have done a great job in their position whether it is the President, Vice President, or other executive board member, by class standing in our on-campus community. This is a great way to reward executive board members who volunteer their time with a little compensation or award for going above and beyond in their positions as student leaders in their halls. Nominations may be made by any Housing Professional Staff member, with a limit of one nomination per yearly service award.

A minimum of three awards shall be given annually based on years of service to the University Housing and Dining Department to students who have maintained **continuous residence** in on-campus University Housing (not including summers). For example, a recipient of the Four Year Service Award must have lived in an on-campus residential community during their entire four years, but will be evaluated primarily on contributions made during the one year being evaluated.

If for any reason there are no qualified/selected candidates in one or more of these categories, the dollars available will be divided among the other selected winners.

Before nominating an individual, they must meet the below criteria:

1. Be a full-time student attending Eastern Illinois University.
2. Be a student completing their first year of school through graduate school.
3. Reside in some form of University owned housing during the entire period of time for which the award has been earned and must return to university owned housing the following year.
4. Have a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or better on a 4.0 scale and be in good judicial standing.
5. Must currently be in an active role in the Residence Hall Association, National Residence Hall Honorary, or Hall/Greek Council.
6. Must commit to being active in a substantial leadership position the following academic year.
7. Candidates' contribution to the university community during the academic year will be evaluated.
8. Financial need is a consideration.

To nominate a student leader:

1. Submit a letter of nomination through our MachForm on our website located at http://www.eiu.edu/housing/hsgscholar_nom.php. Nomination letters are due by **March 3, 2023, by 4:30pm**.
2. Each candidate shall be evaluated on the following criteria (These reflect the qualities of the name sake of the scholarship):
 - i. Demonstrated positive impact made on their living environment and hall council
 - ii. Demonstrated mentoring of fellow residents
 - iii. Served as a positive role model for their residential community
 - iv. Going above and beyond expectations of position or role
 - v. Special consideration will be given to volunteer activities

1. **Before March 10, 2023**, an on-line application for the scholarship will be sent to the nominee via their Eastern Illinois University email address.
2. Nominees must complete the on-line application at http://www.eiu.edu/~housing/hsg_scholar.php by 4:30 pm on **April 7, 2023**.
3. This award will be presented to this year's recipient at the RHA/NRHH Awards Banquet on **Thursday, April 27, 2023 at 5pm**. (additional details to follow)
