Last semester we said goodbye to one of the outstanding Human Services instructors, **Donna Coonce**. Before she moved on to her next Chapter, I (Imani Ryan) had the opportunity to sit down with Ms. Coonce and talk about her time at Eastern Illinois University (EIU).

In her early life, Coonce had not planned to continue with her education after high school. With the encouragement of a friend, she applied to EIU and found her passion as an educator. Coonce began as a student worker and then, taught full time as an instructor in human services for 20 years.

When asked what she learned by being a part of EIU, she explained, "One of the things that I think I have learned the most is how great this community is. 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Featured Student: Dora Tandoh



After receiving her Bachelor's degree in Business Administration, Dora Tandoh ventured to EIU from Ghana and completed her Master's Degree in the Department of Human Services last year. She is pursuing her second Master's Degree this semester and will stay on in the department as a Graduate Assistant (GA) for fall semester. Throughout her time as a GA in the last year, Dora has worked with a variety of faculty and helped with Department recruiting events. Department Chair, Dr. Mikki Sherwood, said, "I don't know what we would have done without Dora this year. She played an instrumental role in developing our program." Dr. Jill Bowers said, "Dora has demonstrated an incredible work ethic as a GA and as a student...she takes a lot of initiative, started her own research project, and her work is always of exceptional quality."

Dora received the best student research award at the Illinois Council on Family Relations Conference in April for her original research on students' experiences with menstrual hygiene practices. Dora was originally nervous about making the move to Charleston, Illinois from Ghana. However, she said she had an interest in social entrepreneurship, wanted to start her own nonprofit one day, and she knew that Human Services was a good fit for her. She said it was a good fit with her business background because "getting this degree will help me to really understand the individuals and families I am trying to help." Dora has made many friends and colleagues and now considers Charleston a second home. We are so grateful she is here!
