Are your alcohol policies effective?

In 2019, Jernigan and colleagues completed a study that evaluated 15 campus alcohol policies (CAPs) from institutions of higher education. They assessed each policy based on accessibility, clarity, effectiveness, and sanctions if the policy is violated.

For accessibility, they found that most policies could be found within 30 seconds and in multiple locations. The researchers found that most policies were written in a way best understood by a college graduate, and therefore difficult to understand by current college students.

Across the 15 CAPs, there were 37 total individual policies. On level of effectiveness, 17 were most effective and 13 were somewhat effective, with the remaining 5 being ineffective or unable to be scored. Five sanctions were found to be most effective, 6 somewhat effective, and 2 ineffective. The 2 ineffective

policies include warning and alcohol education.
