I. Reports and Actions

- Special requests regarding new program proposals that are late (extension to April 24th and/or extension to September 15th). Will require additional vote before summer break.
- IPAC-SAS (IPAC Study Abroad Subcommittee)
 - Report on New Program Proposals/Vote of IPAC
 - IPAC-SAS to develop selection criteria/process for proposals
 - Ranking system parallel with selection criteria/process
 - Procedure: IPAC to receive copies of all proposals OR IPAC-SAS to conduct review and make recommendations?
 - Cap on the # of proposals approved (12-14)
 - Biannual approach should be encouraged
 - Proposals that don't make year two years in a row (wait a year and must be substantially rethought)
 - Higher preference for non-traditional locations
 - Proposal deadlines which favor good marketing strategies
- 4 \$1000 scholarships available for honors students studying abroad. Apps will be due in SP07 for travel in the AY07-08 with priority given to those in semester long programs.








Faculty-Led Study Abroad
