Course Number and Title:	HSL 5985 Aging Studies Internship
Catalog Description:	(Arr.-Arr.-3 to 6) On Demand. An individualized planned work experience in an agency or institution appropriate to the student’s area of specialization. May be repeated once to a maximum of six semester hours credit.
Prerequisites and Notes:	None
Required Text/Materials:	a) Graduate Student/Site Supervisor Internship Packet b) Signed Internship Agreement
Supplemental Materials:	Specific to each intern’s work experience.
Course Objectives:	Students will: a) satisfactorily complete reports in a timely and professional manner; b) demonstrate satisfactory performance evaluations from the Site Supervisor; and c) demonstrate mastery and comprehension in the application of knowledge to professional practice in the internship site and assignment submissions.
Evaluation Methods:	Grade: Credit/No Credit Assignments/Requirements <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Intern Midterm Self Evaluation • Intern Final Self Evaluation • Site Supervisor Midterm Evaluation • Site Supervisor Final Evaluation • Weekly Reports • Internship Project • Final Paper (Summary and Critical Reflection on Internship Experience) • Fulfillment of 40 clock hours of internship on-site and/or off-site work for every 1 course credit hour. (i.e., 120 clock hours = 3 credit hours)
