PROGRAM NOTES

Franz Schubert (1797-1828)

"Rosamunde Ouvertüre," (originally Die Zauberharfe Ouvertüre, 1820), D. 644

Franz Schubert was a child of Vienna born during Beethoven's time, who grew up singing in the Vienna Boys Choir and was to become one of the great early Romantic composers. He was commissioned in 1823 to write incidental music for the play *Rosamunde*, written by Helmina von Chézy. Schubert began composing the more than 50 minutes of music on November 30th and finished it in less than three weeks - two days before the premier on December 20, 1823. Under a great deal of pressure to finish, he found he had overlooked the music for an overture to the play.

Schubert had previously composed music for *Die Zauberharfe* (The Magic Harp), a melodrama, and recycled the overture for *Rosamunde* just prior to the opening of the play. The play was a failure and closed after two performances without a surviving copy. Schubert's incidental music was presumed lost shortly after the failed premier but was found after Sir George Grove and Sir Arthur Sullivan traveled to Vienna in search for the lost compositions of Franz Schubert in 1867.

The work is written in modified Sonata Allegro form typical of Schubert, with a natural succession of themes and repetitions not too far removed from song form.


