Over the past 15 years, this fund has helped support equipment, travel, scholarships, and guest artists for the Jazz Studies Program. With the continued support of Dr. Gholson and other generous donors, the fund has grown and will continue to benefit future generations of EIU jazz students. PURPOSE OF THE JAZZ STUDIES PROGRAM

- To promote jazz as a significant, indigenous American art form.
- To provide an environment for learning and developing the skills necessary to perform, compose, and teach in the professional world.
- To provide support for jazz studies programs in the public schools throughout the region.

BIOGRAPHIES

Sam Fagaly, Saxophone

Sam is the Director of Jazz Studies at Eastern Illinois University. He leads the EIU Jazz Ensemble and is Professor of Saxophone. He has also taught jazz theory, jazz history, and jazz band techniques. Under his direction, the EIU Jazz Ensemble has performed at IAJE, IMEA, and with numerous guest artists such as Joe Williams, Snooky Young, and many others. He has been active as a clinician and guest soloist throughout the nation and has been featured at the Region V North American Saxophone Alliance Conference performing in both classical and jazz styles. He has performed with many distinguished jazz artists including J.J. Johnson, Bobby Shew, and Sarah Vaughan. Before coming to EIU, Sam was a member of the United States Air Force Band of the West. Dr. Fagaly earned his Doctor of Arts degree from the University of Northern Colorado where he studied with Roger Greenberg and Gene Aitken. He recieved his bachelor of Music Education from the University of Florida and his M.M. degree from Louisiana State University.

Scott Hesse, Guitar

Guitarist Scott Hesse is a well-respected figure in the Chicago jazz community. Known especially for his harmonic and rhythmic inventiveness, Scott is equally at home in straightahead or avant garde settings. Since moving to the Windy City in 2005, Scott has played at every major jazz venue in the area. In addition to performing, Scott is an avid composer and music educator.

Since 2007, Scott has led the guitar program at Eastern Illinois University. In 2009, he joined the faculty at Harold Washington College in Chicago. Scott is also a frequent guest clinician at Lane Tech High School in Chicago, where he was commissioned twice to write pieces for their guitar ensemble. Recently, Scott began working with the Thelonious Monk Institute/Gallery 37 music program as a guitar instructor and clinician.

As a leader, Scott has recorded three CDs, and he appears on a host of others. Scott holds a BA in Cultural Studies from Empire State College in New York and a Master's Degree in Jazz Composition from DePaul University in Chicago.

Jamie V. Ryan, Percussion

Jamie V. Ryan is Professor of Percussion at Eastern Illinois University. He plays with the Wisconsin Chamber Orchestra, Heartland Festival Orchestra, and is also in demand as a drum set artist across the Midwest, most notably as the drummer in Sun Stereo and drummer/timbalero in the Afro-Caribbean Jazz Collective. In 1999, he co-founded the Africa->West Percussion Trio, which plays original works influenced by the African Diaspora and the Western tradition and is an ensemble-in-residence at Baldwin Wallace University.

BIOGRAPHIES

Connor Frederick, Trombone

Connor Frederick is a versatile trombonist, composer, and Instructor of Trombone and Jazz at Eastern Illinois University. Connor maintains a career as an in-demand performing artist. In 2024, he joined Latin trap and reggaeton artist Bad Bunny on his Most Wanted Tour as a member of the Miami-based Philharmonic Music Project. He has performed with symphony and chamber orchestras including the Southwest Florida Symphony, Sinfonia de Camera, and Academy of Saint Martin in the Fields. As a jazz and commercial artist, Connor has performed with artists such as Arturo Sandoval, Sal Lozano, Nestor Torres, Wayne Bergeron, Christian McBride, Regina Carter, Dick Oatts, Terell Stafford, and Gordon Goodwin. He has also performed with ensembles including the Chicago-based Afro-Cuban Jazz Collective, Jukebox Saturday Night, and the Blueshift Big Band.

Paul Johnston, Piano

Paul Johnston is a versatile pianist, composer, and educator whose music bridges jazz, classical, and contemporary styles. He has performed with leading artists nationwide, and his compositions and arrangements are often featured by soloists, chamber groups, and jazz ensembles. Alfred Music has published several collections of his solo piano arrangements. A dedicated teacher, Paul taught for over a decade at the Interlochen Arts Camp and serves on the faculty at Eastern Illinois University, where he directs a jazz ensemble, coaches combos, and teaches jazz piano, improvisation, and arranging. He holds degrees from UNC–Chapel Hill and Indiana University, and is an alumnus of Ravinia's Steans Institute and the Henry Mancini Institute.

Ticket Policies

Please note that all ticket sales are final, and refunds will not be given.

Late Arrival

During classical concerts, late seating will only take place during the first convenient pause in the program.

During jazz, folk, world, or pop concerts, late seating is more casual, but ushers may ask you to wait to be seated between pieces. Please check with an usher regarding when you may enter the venue.

Mobile Devices, Photography and Recording

Please turn off all light-illuminating or sound-emitting devices. Mobile phone use is strictly prohibited inside all venues. Text-messaging and the taking of photographs or videos by phone are not permitted.

The use of cameras - with or without flash - and recording devices is a violation of copyright law and discourteous to other audience members.

Failure to comply will result in being asked to leave the performance without a refund.

Doctor and Parent Emergency Calls

If you are a medical professional/parent with a sitter at home, please put you phone on silent and wait to take the call until you are out of the performance venue.

No Smoking

Eastern Illinois University is a tobacco-free campus. Smoking of any kind, including electronic cigarettes, is prohibited on all university property.

Food and Beverages

Food is not allowed inside any of the venues. Only beverages in the special Doudna drink cup, with a secured lid, are permitted in the venues.

Accessibility

Special seating areas for wheelchair accessibility are available. Contact the Box Office in advance to secure a seat in these areas. Audio amplification is available for the hearing-impaired free of charge. A driver's license or other identification is all that is required for deposit.
