BIOGRAPHIES

Adam Larson, Saxaphone

Adam Larson is an American saxophonist, composer, educator and author currently residing in the Kansas City-area. He holds BM and MM degrees in jazz performance from The Manhattan School of Music and was a part of the vibrant NYC jazz scene for eleven years before relocating in 2019. While a resident of the KC-Metro, Larson has held positions at UMKC Conservatory, University of Kansas and The Kansas City Art Institute, and he continues to perform in NYC with some of the greatest musicians in the genre.

As a guest artist, Adam has been invited to present masterclasses on music business, improvisation and composition at more than one hundred universities across the globe. Adam has recorded nine albums as a leader and maintains an active touring and clinician schedule, playing and presenting his original music and educational materials.

Paul Johnston, Piano

Paul Johnston is a versatile pianist, composer, and educator whose music bridges jazz, classical, and contemporary styles. He has performed with leading artists nationwide, and his compositions and arrangements are often featured by soloists, chamber groups, and jazz ensembles. Alfred Music has published several collections of his solo piano arrangements. A dedicated teacher, Paul taught for over a decade at the Interlochen Arts Camp and serves on the faculty at Eastern Illinois University, where he directs a jazz ensemble, coaches combos, and teaches jazz piano, improvisation, and arranging. He holds degrees from UNC–Chapel Hill and Indiana University, and is an alumnus of Ravinia's Steans Institute and the Henry Mancini Institute.

Usher Staff

Ushers are located at the entrance of the venue. If you have a question or a problem, please let them know and they will contact the House Manager.

Ticket Policies

Please note that all ticket sales are final, and refunds will not be given.

Late Arrival

During classical concerts, late seating will only take place during the first convenient pause in the program.

During jazz, folk, world, or pop concerts, late seating is more casual, but ushers may ask you to wait to be seated between pieces. Please check with an usher regarding when you may enter the venue.

Mobile Devices, Photography and Recording

Please turn off all light-illuminating or sound-emitting devices. Mobile phone use is strictly prohibited inside all venues. Text-messaging and the taking of photographs or videos by phone are not permitted.

The use of cameras - with or without flash - and recording devices is a violation of copyright law and discourteous to other audience members.

Failure to comply will result in being asked to leave the performance without a refund.

Doctor and Parent Emergency Calls

If you are a medical professional/parent with a sitter at home, please put you phone on silent and wait to take the call until you are out of the performance venue.

No Smoking

Eastern Illinois University is a tobacco-free campus. Smoking of any kind, including electronic cigarettes, is prohibited on all university property.

Food and Beverages

Food is not allowed inside any of the venues. Only beverages in the special Doudna drink cup, with a secured lid, are permitted in the venues.

Accessibility

Special seating areas for wheelchair accessibility are available. Contact the Box Office in advance to secure a seat in these areas. Audio amplification is available for the hearing-impaired free of charge. A driver's license or other identification is all that is required for deposit.
