CONCERTS: As the summer moves closer to the end and the beginning of the school is just around the corner I wanted to send you a letter about the upcoming concerts, events, and opportunities in store for the year. A full concert schedule can be found on both the Choral and ESO (Orchestra) main page (link at bottom of page). This link will be updated soon. In the meantime I am attaching a document to print for your parents. Please make sure you let your family know about these dates so that they can plan to attend these concerts.

The Eastern Symphony Orchestra is open to all undergraduate and graduate students, alumni, faculty and staff. The string section is comprised of music majors, non-music majors, and community members. Scholarships are available for non-majors! The wind and percussion sections are comprised of the finest music majors in the Department of Music. The Eastern Symphony Orchestra has quickly become one of the premiere regional orchestras in the state of Illinois.

Enrollment: Students may receive academic credit for orchestra participation. All musicians should enroll in MUS 0211. Students receive one hour of academic credit for each semester of participation. Most degree programs will accept orchestra credit as a "free elective." We strongly encourage you to check with your department's academic advisors for details.

Eastern Symphony Orchestra Auditions: All students must audition for participation in the orchestra. ESO and Band auditions will be held during the first two days of school: **Wind/Brass & Percussion auditions** for ESO and EIU Bands will be done simultaneously on Monday, August 22 and Tuesday August 23, 2016. **String Auditions**: Wednesday evening August 24, from 6:00 – 9:00 PM. Strings should prepare two contrasting works from solo repertoire and etudes unless your studio teacher provides you with excerpts.

Wind, Brass Percussion and Strings: consult the studio teacher about audition excerpts and audition times.

Please stop by my office (Doudna Fine Arts center #2425) to sign-up for an audition time and **MAKE SURE** you sign up for the time blocked out for your teacher's studio.

Students auditioning should prepare:

- 1.) audition excerpts provided by your *studio teacher*.
- 2.) all major scales
- 3.) a chromatic scale, demonstrating the range of the instrument
- 4.) sight-reading will be provided.

Performance Schedule: The ESO performs at least twice each semester in formal concerts both on and off-campus. The ESO does participate in local, regional and national tours and competitions. Additional performances each semester for those selected to play in the Eastern Symphony Chamber Orchestra & Collegium Musicum which rehearse during the regularly scheduled times.

Applied Studies (Private Lessons): Students may also study privately for academic credit. Applied study is available for all instruments through the EIU Department of Music. Students must have teacher approval to enroll in private lessons. For more information please visit our website (see below).
