may be in the state library, or stowed in the basement of the state house, specifying the number and kinds of such books that may be in his custody, and report the same to the governor, who shall direct what portion and the number of said books are necessary to be kept by the secretary of state for use of the state; and the secretary of state is hereby authorized to sell or dispose of the remainder of said books at a price to be fixed, and in the manner prescribed by the governor.

22. PROCEEDS: SALES REPORTED.] § 2. On or before the first day of December next the secretary of state shall pay into the state treasury all moneys received by him for the sale of said books, and make a full report of his doings in this matter to the governor.

SEX.

An act to secure to all persons freedom in the selection of an occupation, profession, or employment. Approved 22 March 1872. In force 1 July 1872.

1. OCCUPATION: PROFESSION: EMPLOYMENT.] § 1. No person shall be precluded or debarred from any occupation, profession or employment (except military) on account of sex: *Provided*, that this act shall not be construed to affect the eligibility of any person to an elective office.

2. ROAD LABOR: JURIES.] § 2. Nothing in this act shall be construed as requiring any female to work on streets or roads, or serve on juries.

3. REPEAL.] All laws inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.
