- Appoints a board of trustees to receive the property in trust for the State.

AN ACT to create a board of trustees to take and hold the title the homestead of Abraham Lincoln, in the city of Springfield, the State of Illinois, in trust for the State of Illinois, and provide for the care and custody thereof, and to appropriate mon for paying the custodian to keep and exhibit said homestead the relics and curiosities there collected.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illine represented in the General Assembly: That the Governor, Secreta of State, Auditor, Treasurer, and Superintendent of Public Inst. tion, of the State of Illinois, and their successors in office, she constitute a board of trustees, and, by the name and style of Lincoln Homestead Trustees, shall have power to receive a conve ance from Robert T. Lincoln and his wife, of Chicago, Illinois the homestead of the late Abraham Lincoln, and situate at corner of Eighth and Jackson streets, in the city of Springfield the State of Illinois, and to hold the same in perpetuity, but trust for the State of Illinois; to execute in said name and state and deliver to the said Robert T. Lincoln, a contract covenant with the said Robert T. Lincoln and his heirs, that said homeste shall be forever kept in good repair and free of access to the public under such regulations as they may deem wise, for the proper prop servation of the property and relics and curiosities there collects

§ 2. Said board shall have full authority over and control said homestead; shall have power to contract with reference to the proper care and custody thereof, and of the relics and curiosity there collected, and with reference to repairs of the said homestead, the employment of persons to exhibit the same to the public, and said name and style may sue and be sued in reference to an matters appertaining to the powers and trusts hereby created.

§ 3. It shall be the duty of said trustees to use the moneys the may from time to time be appropriated by the General Assemble so far as can be done with such moneys, to keep said premises a good repairs; to keep the same open and free of access to the pullic at all seasonable hours on week days, and to employ a custodia to care for said premises, and exhibit the same and the relics an curiosities there collected to the public.

§ 4. There is hereby appropriated the sum of three thousar eight hundred dollars to defray the expenses of repairing salpremises and employing custodians and carrying out the purpose of this act, for the period of two years after the approval of the act, and to be paid out of any moneys in the treasury of the Star not otherwise appropriated, on warrants of the Auditor upon the Treasurer, on the direction of a majority of said board, from time to time as the same may be required for the purposes of this action.

§ 5. Said board shall report to each General Assembly befor the twentieth day of the session, a detailed account of all the transactions, and of all expenditures made by them, and also sud recommendations as they may deem proper for the consideration the General Assembly.
