TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

Know Ye, That, in pursuance of the Acts of Congress appropriating and granting Land to the late Army of the United States passed on and since the sixth day of May, 1812, William Kelly

having deposited in the General Land-Office a Warrant in his favour, numbered 5216, there is granted unto the said William Kelly late a Private in the Twenty Sixth Regiment of Infantry

a certain Tract of Land, containing One hundred and Sixty Acres being the South East of Section Ten of Township Two south in Range Seven west in the Tract appropriated (by the Acts aforesaid) for Military Bounties, in the Territory of Illinois To have and to hold the said quarter Section of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said William Kelly and to his heirs and assigns for ever.

In Testimony whereof, I have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land-Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my Hand, at the City of Washington, this Third day of August in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Eighteen and of the Independence of the United States of America the forty-third.
