Your Excelency:~

With hundreds and thousands
of money of the poor people like myself
tied up in the West Side Bank of this
city, crying for bread and justice,
why must the bank go into receivership.
Why can't the auditor of the state open
the bank on 40% basis as thousands
sign waiving.

We the people of the State of
Illinois elected you as our Govenor,
myself and others appeal to you
for the sake of the many poor
and destitute, won't you kindly
see the we get the square deal,
the bank to be re-opened and we get

our 40% at once.

Praying to the Almighty and
hoping sincerely that you will look
into the matter, I beg to remain
